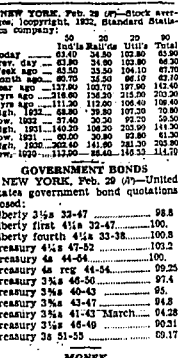

### CITY RESTRICTS EXPENDITURES TO INCOME IN CASH

Twin Falls Councilmen's Survey Indicates \$35,637 Margin Sufficient For Remaining Three Months

Twin Falls expenditures for the fiscal year ending next May 1, will not exceed the city's actual cash income for the year, but will be approximately \$100,000 more than the city's budgeted appropriations for the year, according to financial records and estimates which the city council approved at a regular meeting last evening.

In view of reduction in assessed property valuations, and of a projected decline in anticipated revenue either from taxes, contributions or interest to new this record, with satisfaction. They were not so positive about their ability to calculate so satisfactorily the city's budget for the coming year, and indicated purpose to reduce appropriations to bare necessities in order to keep on the safe side.

Out of \$148,725 which the council budgeted for expenditures during the year, the council's study last night showed there had been collected \$110,541.11, and that the total income for the year, \$139,324.11.

The council's study showed that there had been spent during the first nine months of the year, \$102,097, leaving a margin of \$35,637.41 to meet the requirements of the last three months of the year. Councilmen's estimates indicated this margin would cover necessary expenditures during the remainder of the year.

Out of \$53,000 estimated income from the city's general fund tax levy, the figures showed there had been collected \$50,203.89. Water department revenue estimated at \$77,000, total \$51,181.00 up to March 1.

The figures showed the council had overestimated delinquent tax collections which totaled \$1723 as against the \$5000 estimate. Highway tax which totaled \$332 as compared with the estimate of \$5000, and police fines which amounted to \$2221 as against the \$5000 estimate. February bills which the council voted last evening to pay totaled \$1900.

In addition to its financial study, the council last night received monthly reports of a number of city offices and departments. The waterworks department reported collections of \$4700 during the February and charging \$3771 for collection this month. The fire department chief reported 10 February fire alarms, and stated the department had received 12 complaints and made 100 inspections during the month.

Mr. Kasper Blinn, health inspector, reported, no communicable diseases had been traced to Twin Falls milk supply. As an added measure of disease prevention, he stated, re-testing of dairies' water supply will be made commencing late this month. Routine inspection of the dairies, he said, shows them to be in good condition. Cows, also, are in good condition, he said, despite the severe winter. Bacterial content on milk samples, he said, are well within bounds, and sedimentation is practically nil. The inspector referred in his report to suggestion by Dr. E. C. Jensen, county health unit director, of a plan to test fresh milk and oblige mistakes by requiring dairies to place the date as well as their name and licent number on bottle caps.

The February bill to provide Twin Falls meat supply exceeded that of the preceding month, the inspector reported. Dairy cattle, he said, are well dressed for the trade, and a good grade of prime lambs compared with the preceding month's crop. 150 cattle; 323 hogs, 57 veal and 62 lambs.

Library Business Active  
Twin Falls public library report for January, showing 16332 books issued during the month, brought to the council chambers a new appreciation of the popularity and importance of this institution. Average daily circulation was computed as 572, with issuance of 830 books in one day for a high mark. Twenty-two new books were issued, and was placed as non-fiction. Distribution was divided, 9124 to adults and 5176 to children. New orders during the month numbered 203.

There is no question about that. The difficulty now comes in regard to the guaranteed minimum price to be paid for beets.
