(By The Associated Press) House approves Norris-La Guardia bill to limit use of federal injunctions in labor disputes and outlaw the "yellow dog" contract.

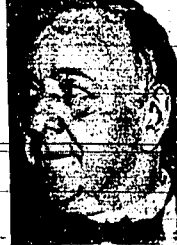

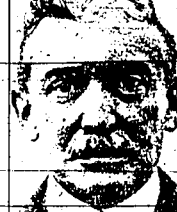

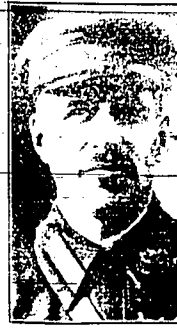
