BOARD AT GOODING FAVORS TAX LEVY

Trustees Decide Upon Levy of 4 Mills and Eight-Month Term of School

GOODING, March 19 (Special to The News)—Gooding public school today announced the decision favoring a 4-mill tax to relieve the shortage of funds which had threatened to close the schools before completion of the prescribed term.

In addition, the board has arranged for an eight-month term of school this year.

Money from taxes provided for this year's expenses was used to pay last year's salaries, study of the situation revealed. This money was used partly to pay for provisions of Idaho statistics, and the remaining deficit, added to the delinquent taxes of this year's budget, produced a treasury deficit which made only a seven-month school term possible, unless delinquencies are collected.

The matter was settled Monday evening by a school board meeting in which a 4-mill tax was decided upon. It was also decided to extend the term of the school from 107 to 127 of the Idaho school laws of 1927.

This tax will afford a fund upon which cash warrants will be written to take care of the eight-month term of school, necessary for graduation-board members reported.

Teachers of the schools agreed to surrender their release contracts for this year if they could be assured an eight-month school, which is the equivalent of a sacrifice of 11.1 per cent of their year's salary.

Plans for the next year are for an eight-month term and "nine months of school" in the month of August. A cut of several thousand dollars has been asked for, involving reduction of some of the schools of study, along with salary reductions.

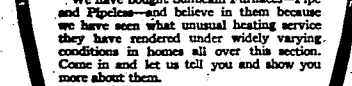

Japanese empire building. Realizing the futility of absorbing the twenty-eight million Chinese of Manchuria into her own empire, Japan may envisage the gradual extension of her rule to the rest of the Great Wall. Until China is again united under his rule, even Japan could be expected to wield a powerful influence.

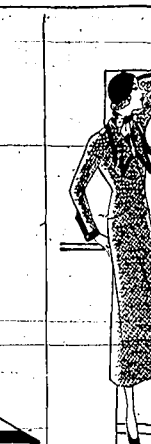

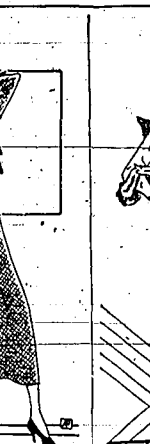
