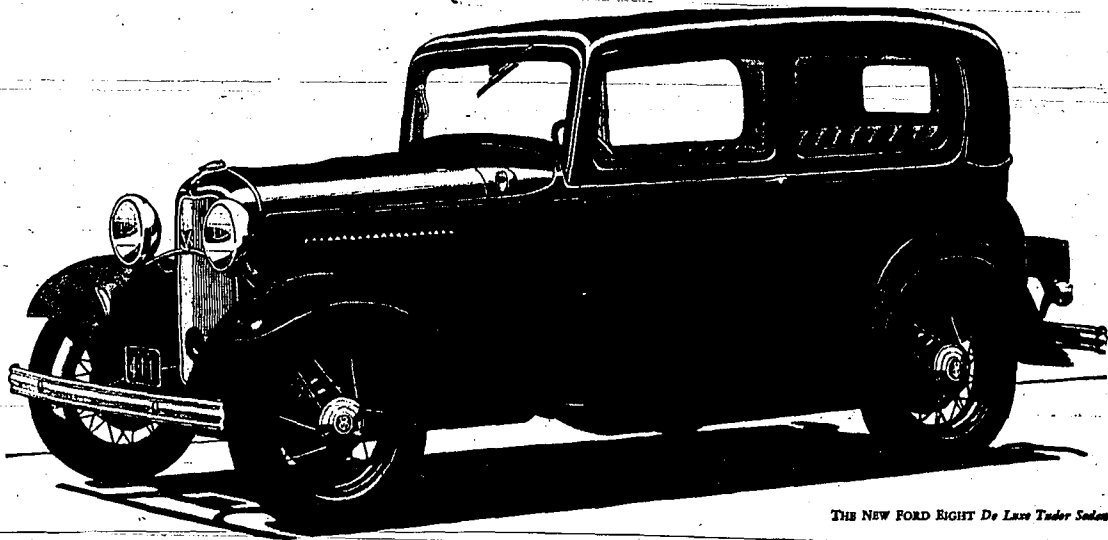

RALLY HALTS SAG ON STOCK MARKET

Covering in Last Quarter Hour Keeps Issues From Dropping to Old Lows

MARKETS AT A GLANCE NEW YORK, March 28 (AP)—Stocks: Irregular; list rises in final dealings after sagging on week's end.

By JOHN L. COOLEY (Associated Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, March 28—Covering in the last quarter hour kept stocks today after a slow decline had carried them unimportantly close to their week's end averages.

A hair's breadth separated the early afternoon level from the bear minimum. But with a violation of that figure ranging in the balance by early afternoon, activity shifted to the market for stocks and prices steadied. Shortly thereafter a look in enough sail to effect a fairly good recovery which was not reduced or cancelled declines. Some leaders closed higher. Sales totaled 1,345,133 all stock.

Nevertheless, financial circles were unwilling to believe that this conquest of the market was the end of the matter and it was doubted with this thought in mind that short commitments were lightened. Another influence on the late turn may have been word that more light was soon to be had on Paris, etc., the support of which such information might help clarify plans of the entire automobile industry.

Whatever the reason for the turn, it was notable that several popular stocks were under less pressure when the market wore its gloomiest countenance. American Telephone, for example, was only a point off at the worst; it closed 1 1/2 higher. Procter and Gamble profited by a reassessment of the market's outlook, finishing 2 1/2 to the good. Case and National Biscuit also bore up well under the pressure.

Specialties, including some food stocks, were also active. International Business Machines dropped 1/2 on the anti-trust charge, although it closed at 4 1/2. Coca Cola, Beech Nut, Wrigley, Drug and Hershey displayed rather comical weakness. The latter, however, United Pacific got back all but a fraction of a point drop and Salsola closed at 2 1/2. The latter average was unable to make complete recovery, but it was noted that last Saturday's bear market minimum was violated.

### COUNCILMEN TAKE STEPS TO CONTROL BIG MOTOR TRUCKS

#### Complaint Over Damage to Pavement and Blocking of Streets Leads to Issuance of Instructions to Police

Something must be done to regulate and control big motor trucks operating in and through Twin Falls, members of Twin Falls city council asserted in the course of discussion at a regular meeting last night in which they brought out that trucks causing serious damage to Twin Falls pavements, and sometimes blocking streets in the wholesale and retail districts.

Swezey, city attorney, made reference, a fine of 10 to 25 is the maximum weight of vehicle and load to be driven over Twin Falls streets.

Operation of heavily-loaded trucks was held to blame for disintegration of the pavement in a number of places, variously estimated at from 20 to 50, which will require attention within the next few weeks. Provision will have to be made in the city's budget for the coming year for a considerable amount of pavement repairs. It was asserted that the city attorney advised, was the maximum weight for which pavement on the principal thoroughfares was designed and built.

### ADVERTISING DEAL GETS DAY IN COURT

#### Twin Falls Man Who Bought Notes Appears As Active Defendant and Claimant

A Twin Falls man, Harry S. Cowling, who purchased notes which he advertised in the local papers, was active defendant and claimant in a suit brought for reclamation of these advertising contracts. It developed at trial in district court here yesterday, the notes approximately \$1000. Suit for reclamation of the contracts was started last November by C. E.
