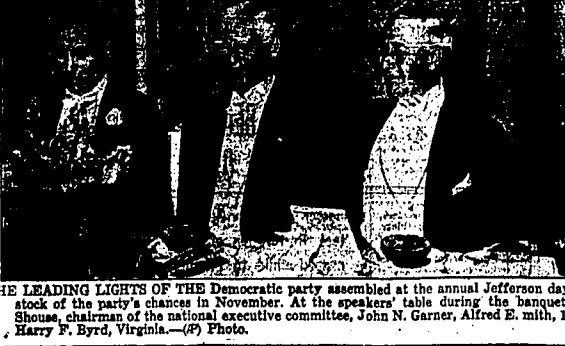

Electric Gadget Replaces Maps In Search For Island Treasure

Operator of Metal-Detecting Device Wears Head Phone in Hunt For Gold



By E. W. NEILL. (Associated Press Staff Writer) VANCOUVER, April 22.—Exploring the legendary pirate chart with his skull and crossbones, an electrical divining apparatus is to be used by modern treasure hunters on far south Cooco Island.

With this new gadget to take the place of maps, a party of five men headed toward this unpopulated Cooco Island dependency hopes to locate the supposedly fabulous wealth buried there by notorious buccannery and pirate chieftains.

Head Phones Used. The operator of the metal-detecting device wears head phones connected with coils of wire on a wheel-shaped frame which an assistant carries.

The apparatus registers a sound when it is directly above a spot containing metal. Its inventor claims, and an acre of ground can be covered in about an hour.

Twenty-four men, commanded by Colonel J. E. Leckie, Vancouver, were aboard the motorship Silver Wave — once tender for Roald Amundsen's flight, across the north pole — when it left in charge of its master, Captain Eldred Hansen.

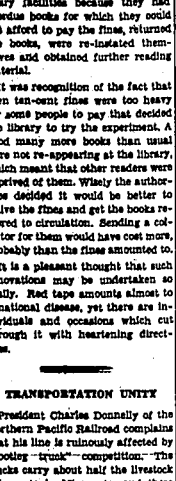
