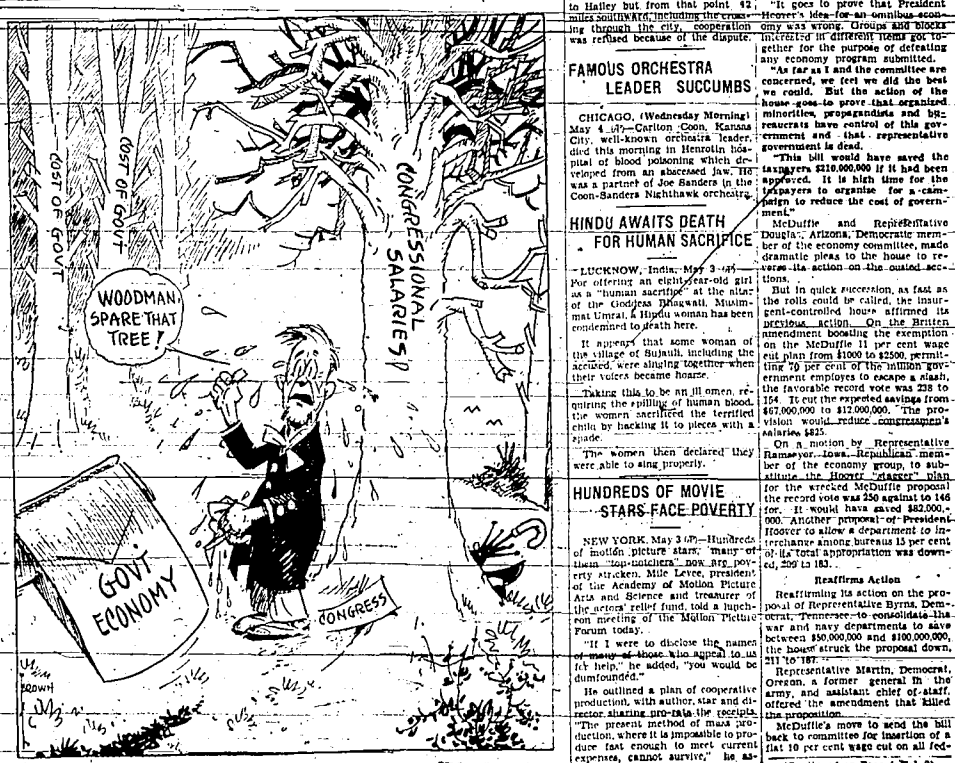

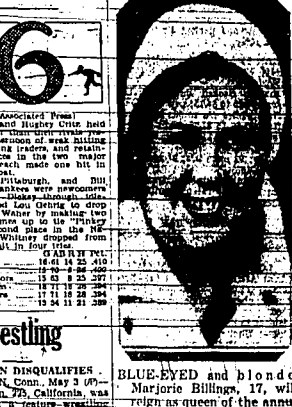

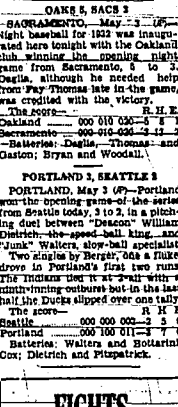

ENGINEERS OUTLINE AGUON FALLS POWER DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Representatives of Eastern Engineering Contractors Announce Purpose to Begin Early Construction

Engineers representing W. B. Barstow and Company, heading, Pennsylvania, engineering contractors, are here to begin construction of a 17,000-horsepower hydro-electric power plant at Aguon Falls, northeast of Twin Falls, A. B. Campbell, vice president of the Barstow corporation, said here last evening.

Aguron Falls power development rights have been held for several years by R. T. Henderson, Denver city, as indicated by a franchise which has been identified for 10 years past with the movement for reclamation of approximately 50,000 acres in and about the Murchaugh irrigation district, comprising what is known as the Barstow project in the Twin Falls and Cassia counties.

Mr. Henderson returned last week after nearly two years absence, having spent most of that time in and about Chicago.

Complete program for the twenty-fifth annual commencement exercises of the Twin Falls high school, which will be held May 20-21-22-23 at the high school gymnasium at which 200 students will receive diplomas was announced yesterday by W. N. Terry, principal.

RESERVOIR BOARD CUTS ASSESSMENT

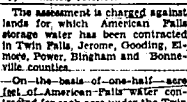
PROMINENT MUSICIAN JOINS LOCAL COMPANY

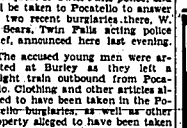
