35-Pound Boulder Smashes Car Roof On Boise Highway

BOISE, May 7 (AP)—D. C. Reynolds and Ben S. Matlock, Eagle, 10 miles west of Boise, escaped death by a missile this afternoon when a 35-pound granite boulder smashed through the top of the coupe in which they were riding along a closed car on the road to Idaho City, 40 miles north of here.

The rock, loosened supposedly by a grazing animal, tore through the light framework of the coupe and struck the closed car after falling no less than 100 feet and came to rest back of the head of the driver, Reynolds, without touching either occupant.

The two men, thrilled enough for one day, stopped their car, turned around and drove back to Boise without completing their mission to the old mining town.

Idaho's \$1,250,000 Highway Program Commences Soon

BOISE, May 7 (AP)—Highway work worth \$1,250,000 will be placed under contract by June 1 under plans announced today by J. H. Stiemmer, director of highways.

The work includes 236 miles of surfacing in preparation for oiling and the oiling which will begin immediately upon completion of the preparatory work. In addition other construction work aside from oiling and resurfacing of roads will be included in the work.

The surfacing and oiling was estimated as costing \$720,000.

Scores of men will be put to work on the various projects. The state is awarding contracts for use of local labor. In addition, each contract requires a statement of the wages to be paid to the workers to be conducted for board and lodging.

Of the resurfacing work in preparation for oiling, 30 miles will be completed by the end of the month on the Old Oregon trail, 11 miles between Burley and Declo on the Rath River highway, 11 miles between Twin Falls and Burley, and 11 miles between Burley and Declo on the Rath River highway.

President's Caustic Criticism of House and Texas Solon's Victory Over New York Man Feature

By D. HAROLD OLIVER (Associated Press Staff Writer) WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—President Hoover's caustic criticism of the Democratic house for failure to point the way to a balanced budget and Speaker Garner's primary victory in California stirred a new battle for new legislative power this week.

With little interest manifested in remaining in the convention of politics and conventions, politicians have settled back to weigh the consequences of these two important developments.

As to the first, President Hoover struck with full force in his message to Congress on Monday, May 3, to praise even his staunchest followers. Placed on the defensive, Democratic leaders immediately rallied in both houses, while one opposition chieflain heard the message as the speaker of the house, Raymond Chandler. Much more is expected to be heard on this subject in the coming days.

The victory of "Texas Jack" Garner in California came as a blow to those hoping to nominate Franklin D. Roosevelt on the first ballot, although they believe future events will make that possible.

Primaries and conventions continue to swell the total delegates pledged and claimed for President Hoover's renomination. Washington state gave him 19 and 11 more today, bringing his total to 618, including 35 claimed, with only 57 needed to nominate. A total of 618 delegates is required to elect Roosevelt.

With 710 of two-thirds required to nominate Roosevelt, the following lineup tonight stood as follows: Roosevelt, instructed, pledged 233; Hoover, instructed, pledged 166; Garner, pledged 46; Clegg, pledged 36; Murray, instructed, pledged 23; Total 404.

Roosevelt's managers still claim he has the support of more than 500 votes, despite California. While spokesman James E. Parsons is insisting that the claim, do not specify where they expect the additional votes to come from, he reported to department officials that he believed they would be based upon their belief that various factors will result in their support.

SILVER QUESTION CLAIMS HOOVER'S ATTENTION AGAIN

Washington Senator Takes Matter Up With Chief Executive After Brief Expresses Ideas to Senate

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—The much-discussed question of an international silver conference echoed today in the president's office, with a senatorial advocate of silver renomination declaring himself satisfied with the chief executive's stand.

Senator Jones, Republican, Washington—reporting he had discussed the silver problem with Mr. Hoover—said that, although the president had not spoken flatly, he personally believed a concrete proposal for rehabilitating the metal, if brought to the White House, would result in invitations to an international conference.

Slueth Involved in Defrauding Lindbergh Baby Hunters Hides \$100,000 Well

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—The washing of the \$100,000 paid to the kidnappers of the Lindbergh baby today led department officials to believe that the man in the nation's capital as a part of a far-flung investigation.
