# SESSION CONSIDERS PLANS FOR SOLVING PROBLEM OF LABOR

### Meeting at Probate Court Room Takes Up Matter of Employment of Workmen Here in Thinning Beets

Tentative plans for the purpose of securing more work for local labor in beet fields were considered at a meeting in the probate court room here last night attended by about 30 persons including a delegation of workmen: E. F. Frazer, sheriff; W. K. Dolson, deputy, and A. J. Hagar, district superintendent of the Amalgamated Sugar company. The session was called by the board of county commissioners and presided over by E. J. Finch of that body.

Another meeting will be held at 1 P. M. in the American Legion Memorial hall today at which workers, officers and Mr. Hagar will further discuss the situation. Mr. Hagar pointed out that the Amalgamated company owns neither the farms nor the beet and that it is necessary to get in touch with farmers and satisfy them.

Sheriff Frazer and J. L. Woodford, chairman of the labor committee presented a list of 110 men having 400 dependents who are out of work. It is stated, and many of whom were sided last winter and would have to be again next winter should they not be employed.

It was stated that this list was collected within two hours and did not nearly exhaust the number of unemployed thinnery workers in this city. O. W. Witham is said to be examining the statutes with a view of deporting any illegally in this country.

The substance of the argument of the men was that Mexicans who had drifted into this city have been employed in many fields to the ex-

clusion of resident Americans. At first there seemed to be an impression that the Sugar company had imported these or some of them, but this Mr. Hagar denied. He said he stood ready to prove by affidavit that the company had not paid railroad fare or furnished board to a single one of them and that 200 letters had been sent out from the company office here in response to inquiries urging men not to come. He said that early in the year he had written about a dozen letters in response to queries from old employees explaining the situation and condition of the crops, which was discouraging but said letters during the last month discouraged men from coming. He offered to show files of copies of letters to this effect.

The matter of efficiency of labor was discussed. Mr. Hagar said that many farmers were protesting against employment of Willie men, but that they were not efficient in the beet fields. Mr. Woodford admitted this was the case in some instances but said he and a party of men, some of whom were present, had cleared a large field at the Thomas farm, Platteau, Mr. Hagar said it was 100 per cent perfect. It was

countered by some of the labor committee that many Mexicans were inefficient. Willie Hagar admitted and told of one instance some years ago when only 24 out of 100 were perfect. He contended that resident Mexicans were good workers, and no criticisms were made against their employment.

Mr. Hagar said that of 1200 men employed in the fields here only 200 were perfect. A lot of these were residents of this city for a long time—relative to a lot comprised by a representative of the company and Mr. Finch early in the year, with the promise that they would be called for, he contended that records showed that 30 per cent of these were not at home when called for.

Suggestion was made by James L. Darrin, commissioner, that laborers offer to work half a day in the field every week—two Saturdays a month. It was stressed that employment for men now meant less expense and less taxes and that cooperation all around would be better. The idea of putting the matter to the farmers in this light, with inquiries from the labor union met approval of the workers.

The regular committee representing the workers included D. G. Kernigan, G. P. Hartley, Jim Wilson, Robert Stafford and C. B. Bellstrom.

The best of feeling prevailed during the meeting, though many workers are said to be resentful of the lack of employment.

While the meeting was in session, Dolson was called to the telephone and, after conversation, announced that a farmer had telephoned to say that he did not want Willie men in his field as they were inefficient and if anyone thought to drive Mexicans away, there would be trouble.
