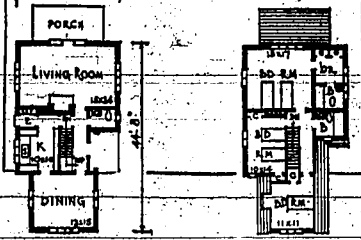

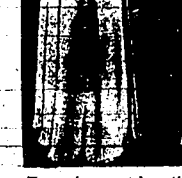

The story was retold to the Lewiston Tribune by George Love, state cougar trapper, who came upon her cabin on the Salmon river during his winter hunt.

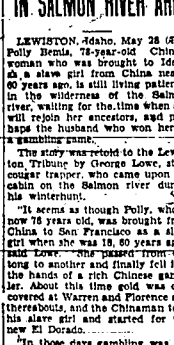
"It seems as though Polly, who is now 78 years old, was brought from China to San Francisco as a slave girl when she was 18, 60 years ago," said Love. "The passage from one place to another and finally fell into the hands of a rich Chinese gambler. About this time gold was discovered at Warren and Florence and thereabout, and the Chinaman took his slave girl and started for the new El Dorado."

"In those days gambling was the favorite pastime of the miners and stakes were often high. The story goes that the Chinaman met a man named Bemis, who was then in Warren, and they indulged in a friendly game of poker. In the game luck smiled on Bemis and he won the Chinaman and his slave girl and the end Bemis had all the Chinaman's wealth. The last wager was a fabulous sum put up by Bemis against Polly. As Bemis won, the Chinaman broke, left the country, Bemis married the girl and they lived happily together until his death several years ago."

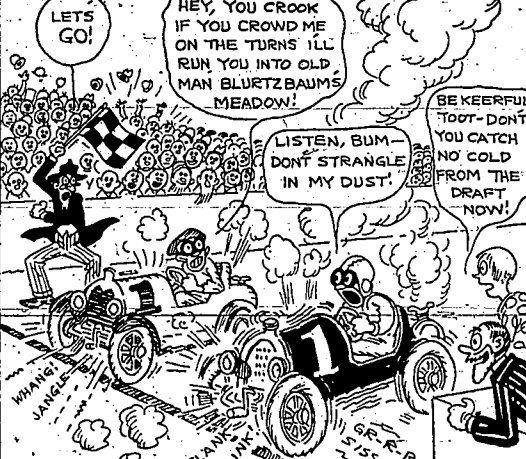

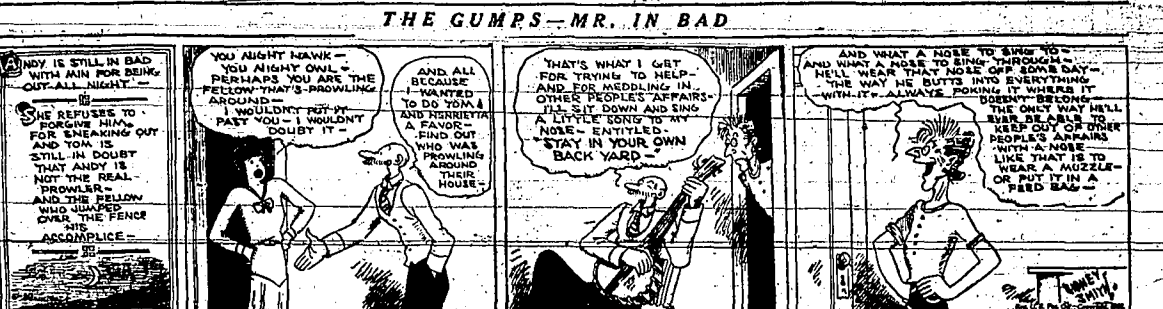
