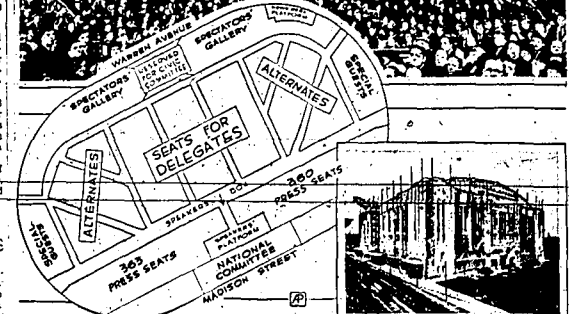

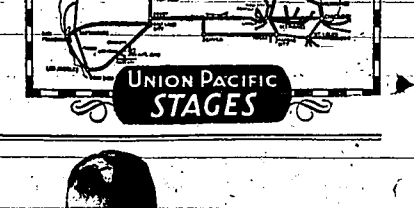

# Max Schmeling's Improvement Impresses Sport Critics

## Work-Out Brands German Champion As Worthy Boxer

Touton Practices at Training Camp with Finesse and Polish—Backed by Calmness and Full Confidence

KINGSTON, N. Y., June 13.—Max Schmeling, who proved his right to the heavy world championship of the world engaged today in a work-out that stamped him for his 15-round bout with Jack Sharkey, June 21.

Memories of the push-absorbing champion who led the Boston sailor two years ago to win on a fortunate loss in the fourth round, a champion who had proved warrior who ploughed through 17 of 19 rounds in his last round, last night at the sight of the Schmeling of the past.

He handled three sparring partners with ease, out-boxing them through five rounds, belting them with short left hooks to the head, stunning them with charging rights. There was a calmness and cockiness about every move he made that has not been seen since the beginning of the past.

He still does not believe in putting his assistants unnecessarily working more as a student using a gymnasium for a laboratory. He followed his own method, which he staggered all three men several times.

Folish of Champion  
He practiced blows today, with the finesse and polish of a champion, blows that he had not heard of from the "mercurial" come-hither two years ago.

Schmeling no longer blocks left hooks with his chin, standing before his body, when an opponent loses his feet, he carries both hands high, picking the leather out in the air, pulling away from punches, while he slips inside to whang short, jolting smashes to the body.

Please advise."

Similar offer was made to Johnny Buckley, Jack Sharkey's manager, at Orangeburg, New York. Both were signed by the same party, who is promoting a 20-round fight between Bessie and Lovinsky here on July 4.

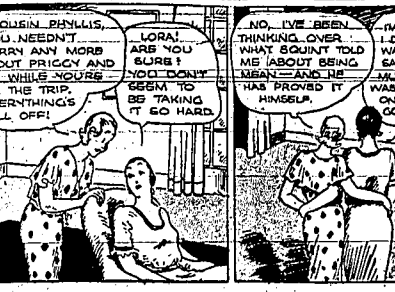
