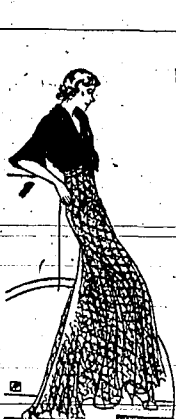

 PARIS, July 2.—Accessories for summer clothes are taking on new angles.
 Belts of straw, shoes of printed silk, cotton gloves and flower dog collars are all used to make costumes incidental as novel as frocks themselves are plain.
 Belt and bag ensembles are one of the favorite novelties. A bag of white straw trimmed with applique bands of black patent leather has an accompanying white straw belt-ton to be worn with a black crepe frock and a white straw hat.
 Another belt and bag ensemble is made of green houselike and worn with a green and white print frock.
 Gloves are short, plain and made of water-tang or fabric with blue palms and fingers, while white gauntlets with red hands, crocheted collar and heavy knitted silk slippers are all newer notes in the glove category than kid or suede models.
 Flowers are used in a dozen different ways. A dog collar of white chrysanthemum finishes a simple black crepe frock, a travat of nasturtiums is worn with a brown crepe blouse buttoned with carved ivory, olivaceous, reptile skin and stonewood plaques are seen on the broad, Japanese styled halteres.
 The flower trim is equally smart on formal clothes. A black chiffon dinner dress has two stark white lilies resting on its shoulder, the décolletage of a cream crepe is rimmed with blue cornflowers and a black crepe afternoon frock is edged with a cluster of six pink roses at the base of the V-neckline.

 HOLLYWOOD, July 2.—The question, "What does a movie star do when she retires?" has been answered by Baby Peggy, who once was one of the most popular young ladies on the screen.
 "She rides horseback," says Peggy. Possibly this answer does not hold a horse to and from her class room.
 For the past three years Peggy, who is Miss Montgomery, now that she is approaching 14 years, has been living with her parents on their ranch, near Laramie, Wyoming.
 The school she attended is three miles from her home, and daily she rode a horse to and from her class room.
 Incidentally the school house, in the same Douglas Fairbanks, indirectly responsible for Peggy's movie career, used in 1918 when he filmed "The Man from Painted Post."
 Peggy broke into the movies before either one of them talked, when she was 20 months old. That was in 1918. Until she was 7 years old Peggy appeared in exactly 100 two-reel comedies and five features. She got "star billing" when she was a few months past 2 years.
 Nearly four years in vaudeville came after her movie work, followed by the retirement to the Wyoming ranch.
 Peggy has popped up to five feet three inches, and she weighs 100 pounds.
 But her deep brown eyes still retain that mischievous sparkle that caught the attention of a director looking for an alert baby so many years ago.
 Peggy, back to take another film in pictures, says she is going to play school girl roles for a while, but she has her heart set on being an honest ingenue.

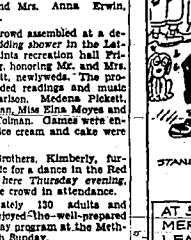

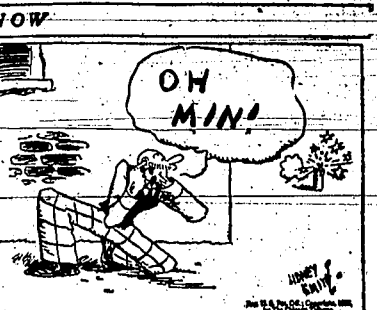
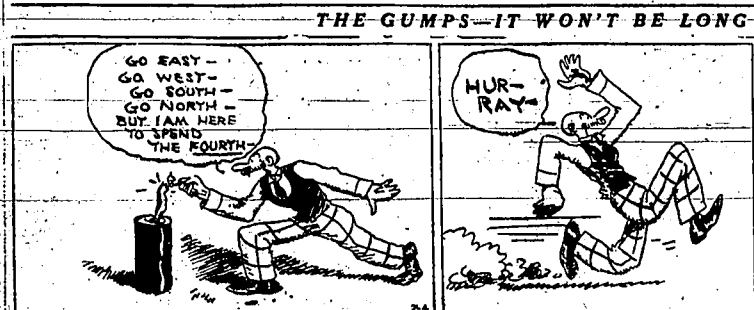
