AMERICAN WOMEN ESCAPE INJURIES

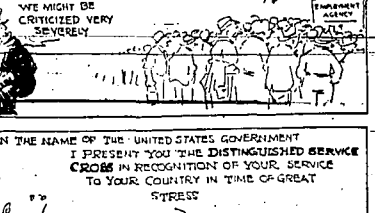

WATERS RUSHING DOWN FROM SONORA MOUNTAINS CAUSE \$75,000 LOSS IN NOGALES NOGALES, Ariz., July 8 (AP)—Flood waters rushing down from the mountains watershed of Sonora, inundated the low border cities of Nogales to a depth of four feet late today, causing damage estimated at \$75,000. The flood was caused by a torrential rain which lasted an hour accompanied by a high wind. Automobiles abandoned in the streets by their owners as the water mounted higher, were overturned and some were crushed. The result was that many motorists endeavored to steer their cars to higher ground. The stream in the Arroyo, which extends through the central section of both cities, left the banks and overflowed into the streets and into a large oil tank of the local power company and 17,000 gallons of high grade oil were spilled into the streets and into nearby homes. Railroad tracks were undermined and street cars overturned. The fence separating the United States from Mexico was torn down as debris washed against it. Citizens became homeless and their belongings were swept away. The Nogales city hall and adjacent buildings were inundated by a foot of water. As the water subsided the population started digging out from under a thick coating of mud and debris which settled in some homes and business establishments to the depth of a foot. The water pumped water from basements and cleared debris from the streets.

ARC OFFICIALS PROBE MYSTERIOUS FATALITY ARCO, Idaho, July 8 (AP)—An inquest into the death of Pat Glynn, whose body was found in an Arco creek in Antelope valley yesterday, was adjourned until Monday forenoon after several witnesses had been examined. Glynn was a 35-year-old man. The lungs revealed death was due to drowning. The victim originally had been examined by a coroner. His neck was broken when the body was found and the foreclosed bore bruises. Officials believe Glynn was robbed and murdered. His body was thrown into the ditch after death. A special investigator was being brought from Pocatello today.

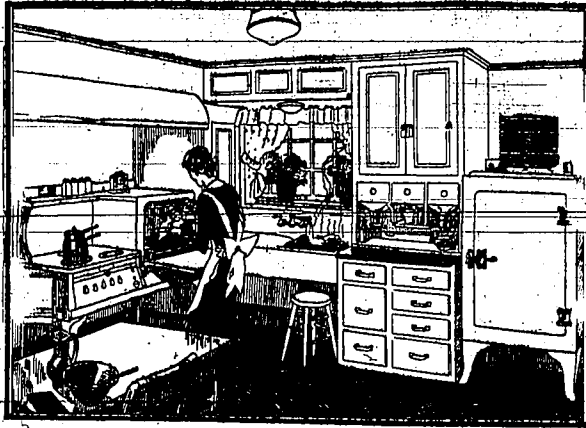

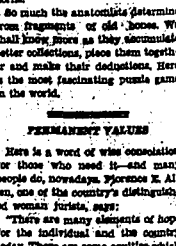

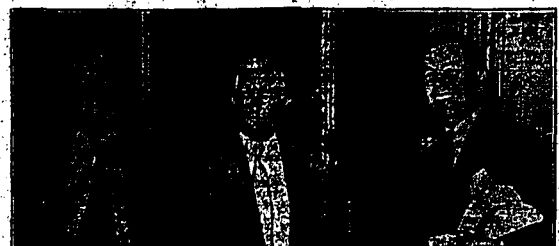
