(By The Associated Press) NEW YORK, July 23.—Last of the "A. J. Smith leaders" apparently was won over by the Roosevelt cause today.

Governor Joseph B. Ely, Massachusetts, who remained the only one of the "Happy Warrior" contingent to support Roosevelt in New York conference, spent two and a half hours in conference at the executive session.

When the session was over it was evident from the conference reports that the Roosevelt campaign had been reached wherever they will endorse Roosevelt in a statement.

At the conference headquarters in New York, Roosevelt's friends were the opening part of his campaign at the stadium in Columbus, Ohio, on July 25.

Ohio, which has gone Republican in seven of the last nine presidential elections, is one of the states the Roosevelt forces have said they are determined to win this year.

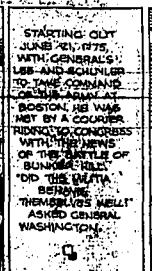
