BOUMAN (Associated Press Staff Writer) BRUNN, July 29.—Chancellor Franz von Papen, whose cabinet is made up of men powerful in the Junker and military caste of the imperial government, assured the United States in a trans-Atlantic broadcast tonight that neither he nor his cabinet were maneuvering for a German dictatorship.

His address, in which he assailed the Versailles treaty, took on significance because of two factors. At home Germany is embroiled in the campaign for the Reichstag elections Sunday, and abroad she is involved in a new difference with Great Britain.

# OTTAWA OBSERVERS NOTE DELEGATIONS' CHANGING OUTLOOK

## Series of Independent Trade Agreements Among British Dominions Gains in Favor Over Empire Preference

OTTAWA, July 29.—Observers at the imperial economic conference are beginning to think the broad program of Empire preference so widely discussed before the conference began, may give place to a series of independent trade agreements among the dominions.

Those who think so cited these three developments:

1. Yesterday in which he asked the dominions to remember their favorable trade balance with the United Kingdom when they asked for further advantages, and in which he said Great Britain ought to be ready to accept a tariff on her industries can compete on a par with those of the dominions.
2. At a meeting by India, South Africa and the Irish Free State, none of which will permit the conference to forget that they consider themselves not integral parts of the British Empire but independent nations affiliated to it.
3. Continuing progress of de-centralization looking toward bilateral trade agreements as contrasted with official action on the status of the empire utility project.

These bi-lateral negotiations have been of such character that they would be desirable to subsequent empire utility, but they are poly-centralized to fit in with any workable scheme of inter-empire trade.

The presentists thus far do not suggest protective tariffs against goods coming from other countries of the commonwealth and in respect they are considered to coincide with the principle of the freest possible exchange of goods between the various parts of the empire.

But they are not interpreted as indicating any intention to disavow the advantages which one empire might experience in the market.

American observers heard today that the dominion also was negotiating an agreement with the United States for the British market.

This was regarded as a result of the fact that the British are to receive the Irish Free State by reason of which the British supply of fresh beef to the southern Ireland may be threatened.

# MOTOR REGISTRATION IN GEM STATE DROPS

BOISE, July 29.—Registration of automobiles in Idaho during the first six months of 1932 is the lowest in the history of the state, according to a report of the bureau of motor licenses stated today.

Registration to June 30 was 72,400 automobiles compared with 80,811 automobiles licensed in the first six months of 1931.

Revenue from the license sales dropped off correspondingly from \$1,700,000 in 1931 to \$1,172,231 this year.

Decreases in license fees of nearly all classes of automobiles were noted except in trailers where there was a startling increase from 20 to 25 per cent this year.

At the bureau it was explained the increase was brought about in large part by many farmers and others operating trailers instead of license their trucks.

Licensing, with corresponding revenue, for the first six months of this year follows:

Temporary license brought in \$10,000.

There was a marked reduction in dealers' number scaling down from 371 a year ago to 253 at present, with dealer license receipts dropping from 20,220 to 18,000.

policeman yesterday in the struggle which led district officials to notify President Hoover they could no longer cope with the situation.

For the thousands of veterans with no refuge now but the streets or the open road and no belongings except their own bodies, the food question became acute.

Efforts were being made by leaders of the army to obtain for the scanty food supplies at various points on the way to Washington.

One group of 230 veterans was evicted at noon today from waterfront in Southwest Washington. As they headed for the railroad yards in the hope of catching a box car lift to the Pennsylvania city, they complained they had been given no time to prepare their meager meal and were starting their journey on empty stomachs.

Some of the veterans who took to the highway found transportation aboard trucks ordered placed at their disposal by Governor Albert G. Ritchie, Maryland, just outside Washington.

"That 300 more trouble" it appeared was indicated by the return of several veterans yesterday from Fort Myer, Virginia, yesterday from Fort Meade, and today from Fort Belvoir, Illinois, to the 23 structures of soldiers back to the army camp.

The ruins of the big camp at Annapolis, Md., were completely destroyed when they were kept entirely closed of veterans. At the other encampments, occasional veterans were allowed to stray into buildings which they had been unable to carry away.

One group of more than 200 veterans who had sought shelter for the night in Virginia was escorted back to Washington by 100 Virginia National Guardsmen, and another group of 100 was escorted by Maryland National Guardsmen.

Throughout the night and day a strengthened guard was maintained outside the White House where it was said a number of threatening telegrams from radical organizations were received.

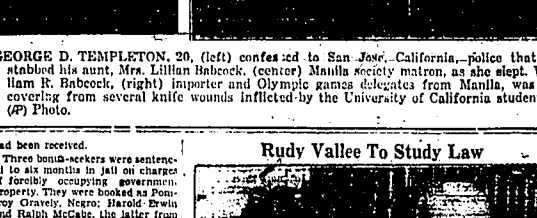

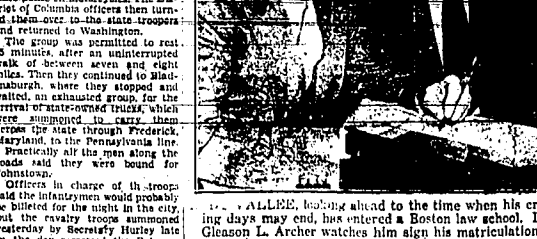

# VON PAPPEN TERMS DICTATORIAL TALK WITHOUT GROUNDS

he served the old imperial government at Washington.

The treaty of Versailles, Minister Colonel von Pappen said, is the main cause of the Fatherland's distress; it fosters racialism both of the East and the West.

"But, whereas National Socialism the Fascist movement led by Adolf Hitler, applies to national regeneration," the chancellor declared.

"Communism is directed against the cultural foundation of our national social life and is, therefore, a revolutionary movement and a danger to the country and to the world."

He referred to a statement in a book on Germany by George N. Shuster, American author, to the effect that the principle of German unity is diversity.

"This may be right," he commented, "but the quest for order and authority constitutes a fundamental trend in the German character."

Referring to the political events of the last few weeks, the chancellor said: "The outside world does not quite realize that Germany was endangered by a danger of civil war due to extremist fanaticism."

The Communist he continued, had built power; fighting unions throughout France and the recent disorders were due mainly to their illegal activities, which no government could tolerate in Germany without relinquishing its own authority.

"Order now has been reestablished throughout Germany," he said. "The present government will see that the order of the day is not circumstances is disturbed."

The administration of Prussia by a federal committee, he said, was intended to be permanent and the independence of the German states will not be touched, he characterized.

He expressed the hope Sunday's elections would justify the measures that his government has taken.

"Since my appointment as chancellor," he said, "I have been expected to bring about a change in the political situation in Germany. Neither myself nor my colleagues will support such a move."

He concluded: "The world is a bitter-tempered conqueror of the world by conquering ourselves with God's help in a spirit of solidarity for the 'commonwealth.'"

Foreign Minister von Neurath's statement, French Ambassador Andre Francois-Poncet was an answer to a protest by the ambassador about a radio talk last Wednesday by General von Schleicher.

His protest was followed by another in Paris where Premier Herriot told Leon Blum, French minister of the German ambassador, that the speech was tactless and inopportune.

He added that the French ambassador which referred to the French attitude toward disarmament as hypocritical.

Meanwhile, as the campaign for next Sunday's Reichstag election continued last night, the reports that storm troops of Adolf Hitler's National Socialist party were concentrating in various parts of Germany. 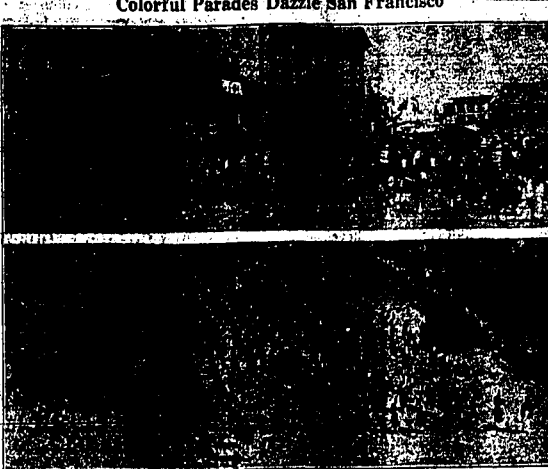

Comparative Figures Show Drop to \$63.32 Per Pupil Last Year From \$75.31 Average Cost in 1929

Cost of education in Twin Falls public schools has been declining steadily the past four years, according to figures made public by the board of education yesterday. Comparative figures show the average cost per pupil in 1929 was \$75.31, \$70.49 in 1930, \$68.49 in 1931, \$66.49 and in 1932, \$63.32.

The district's financial statement for the year ending last June 30 lists buildings and grounds, furniture, fixtures and equipment valued at \$287,122, with an outstanding \$33,000 bonded debt.

Revenues from all sources during the past year totaled \$239,137.26, and expenses, evidenced by warrants issued on all funds, amounted to \$377,192.53.

There remained in the hands of the district treasurer at the close of the year \$79,981.28 cash, and other assets totaling \$200,000 bonds and \$31,888.03 delinquent taxes, making a total of \$181,870.31.

With deduction of \$9,588.67 warrants payable for the year past, the statement showed a surplus of \$100,281.64.

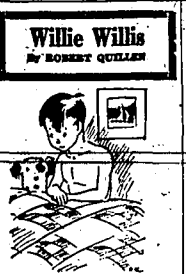
