FARMER AT RUPERT SUCCUMBS IN HOME

Jacob Dockter, 42, Native of Russia, Dies Suddenly After Short Illness

RUPERT, Aug. 4 (Special to The News)—Jacob Dockter, 42, well known here, died Thursday night in his home 1 1/2 miles southeast of Rupert this morning. He was believed to have been in perfect health, working in his cellar a short distance from the house at about 9 o'clock, a sudden illness caused him to go into his chest. He sat down then to get ready for bed, but died before he could get to bed, death being instantaneous.

Mr. Dockter was born in Russia in 1890 and came to America in 1907. Going to Martin, South Dakota, where he lived until his marriage in 1911 to Regina Henne, with their four children, survived.

Soon after their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Dockter came to Idaho, going first to American Falls and in 1921 to Rupert and engaged in farming. Two years ago they purchased the farm where they were living.

Besides his wife, one son, Herbert, 20; three daughters, Ella, 16; Freda, 16; and Erna, 11; two brothers, John, 46, and George, 37; a sister, Mrs. Eva Klein, Aberdeen, Idaho, and his mother, two brothers and two sisters in Russia survived.

It is regrettable that present workers at the camp were willing to continue without salary, but in view of the history of money for the purchase of milk, butter, and other commodities it was decided it would be best to close.

The committee has sent for the money, which seemed to be longer in coming than was thought, and it was hoped would clear through the banks; but unfortunately this was not the case.

A final program will be presented before the public Sunday afternoon, during which time an exhibit of their hand-work and show program will be given. The major band, composed of 28 students, led by Olen Davis, will play during the afternoon.

CASSIA COUNTY'S VALUATION DROPS

Reduction on Real Property Roll, Totals \$923,026, and On Personal, \$123,001

BURLEY, Aug. 4 (Special to The News)—Sharp decline in the valuation of Cassia county real estate is shown by the abstracts of 1932 valuations forwarded to the state auditor by County Auditor B. P. Wilson. There are also reductions in the personal property rolls.

Abstracts for 1932 show real and personal valuations totaling \$4,720,415, while the 1931 totals were \$7,163,599. There is a reduction on the real roll of \$223,026 and on the personal roll of \$123,001. These figures omit consideration of the subsequent roll, and the next period two weeks short of its schedule.

The major factor of reduction this year is the decreased valuation set on irrigated lands by the Cassia county board of equalization. They decreased valuations of irrigated lands in the Oakley valley section 15 per cent, and elsewhere in the county by 10 per cent.

Milk cows were 300 less in number than in 1931, with a decrease of \$23,203 in valuation. Horses and mules were 1030 fewer with a reduction of \$46,703 valuation. There were 210 less hogs, valued at \$926 less. Hauling logs increased \$12,138. Improvements on agricultural lands fell off \$2,225, while improvements on residence lots increased \$34,640. Hauling logs improvements decreased \$49,742.

Machinery fell \$35,575; merchandise dropped \$57,061; sugar dropped \$10,000 while the sugar corn factory valuation remained the same, \$230,000. Legal exemptions decreased \$21,435. Private law libraries and sur-

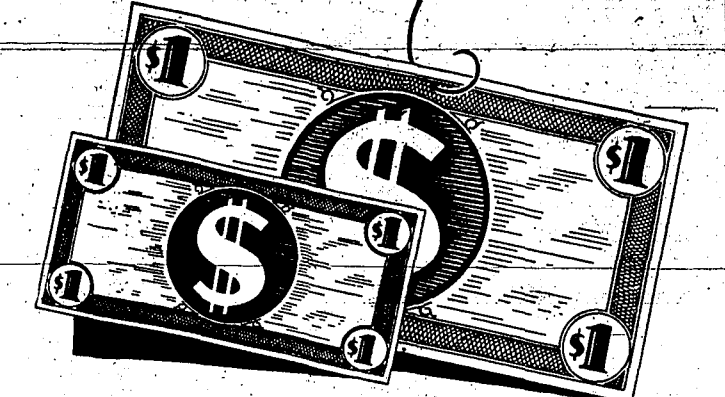
