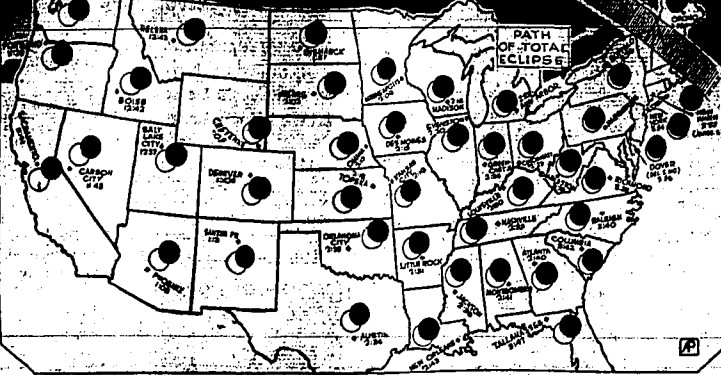

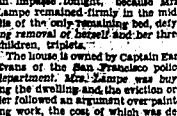

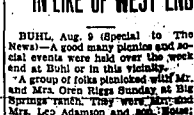

Broken Lines Give House Distinction

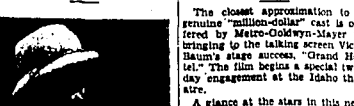

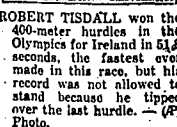
