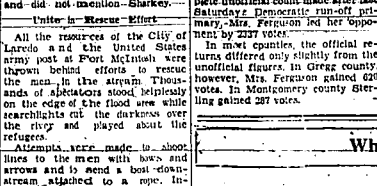

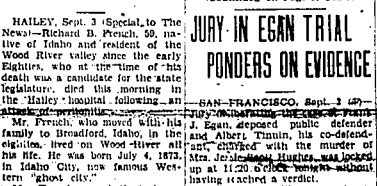

Gene Olenlager, 6, son of the trainman, dies under Oakley Branch Engine

BURLEY, Sept. 3 (Special to The News)—Gene Olenlager, six-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Z. Olenlager, was fatally killed at Oakley today when he was run over by the Oakley branch train of the Oregon Short Line.

The boy's older brother, together with a boy friend, had gone fishing and it is thought that Gene must have followed them, though no one saw the accident.

The boy's father is employed by the railroad company as an engine tender, and the family lives near the railroad. The engine and nine cars passed over the body, severing the head and right arm. None of the train crew saw the boy, until after the train had passed.

The child is survived by his parents, four brothers and a sister. The funeral will be held at 2 P. M. tomorrow at the D. E. Johnson mortuary. Services will be held Tuesday afternoon in the Second ward chapel of the Church of Jesus Christ, Latter-Day Saints.
