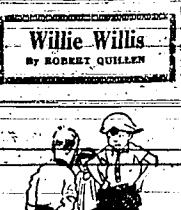

William S. Mallory, 85, Twin Falls business man and veteran justice of the peace and a resident here since 1904, died Wednesday morning at his residence, 430 South avenue north, from a cerebral hemorrhage, following illness of three months' duration.

Arrangements for funeral services were held in his home last evening, awaiting a word from son, C. D. Mallory, Los Angeles. The body rests at the home of the late justice.

During more than a quarter of a century residence in Twin Falls, Mr. Mallory was actively engaged in the real estate trade and for a number of years engaged in an insurance and loan business.
