The program was given by Mrs. J. D. O. West was next presented in a duet. The group then engaged in a social pastime and entertainments.

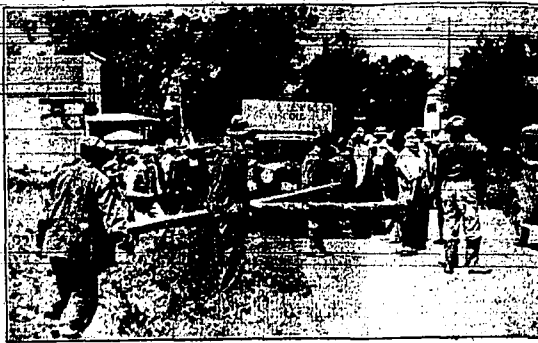

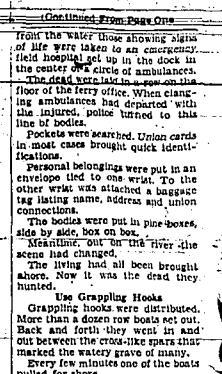

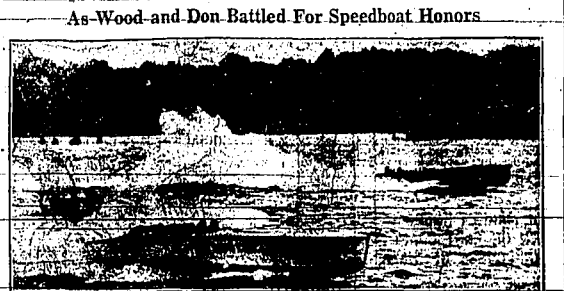
Dictators of Major League Sport Also Fix Dates and Places for Coming "Titular" Diamond Frays
