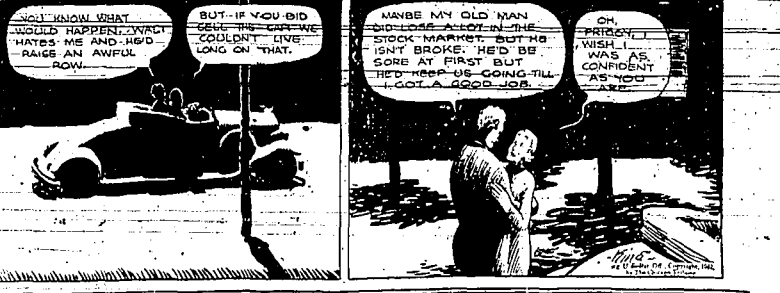

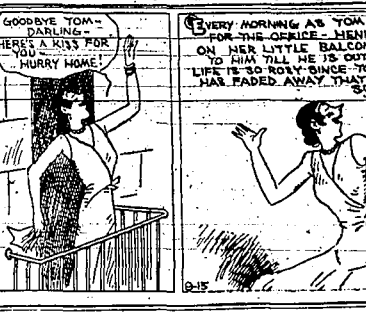

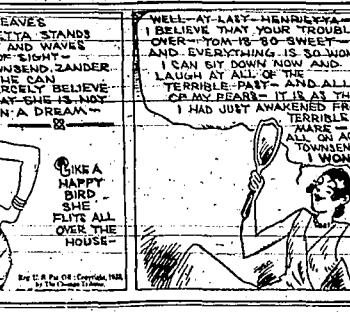

# CHAMBER STUDIES RECIPROCAL TRADE WITH LOS ANGELES

Board Favours Nevada Road Work, Freight Rate Cuts, and Interchange of Local and California Products

Five points designed to build up business between Twin Falls and Los Angeles were suggested last evening by the directors of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce in a conference with Albert V. Weigel, domestic trade commissioner of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, who arrived here yesterday for the purpose of spending two days in this vicinity in the interest of increased reciprocal trade relations between the two communities.

Members of the board of directors urged the advisability of cooperation on the part of the Los Angeles commercial body in increasing tourist travel to Twin Falls from southern California, in connection with this second point, assistance in securing completion of the earliest possible moment of sections of United States highway number 20 in the state of Nevada, was taken up and stressed. The directors furnished the visiting commercial representative with facts bearing on this subject

Lowering of transportation charges on southern Idaho products to southern California and to southern Idaho was given consideration and mutual cooperation favored.

# CALIFORNIAN TELLS OF TRADING PLANS

Los Angeles Chamber Representative Points Out Reciprocal Business Plan

Benefits of reciprocal trade between Twin Falls and southern Idaho and the Los Angeles section were pointed out yesterday at the weekly meeting of the Twin Falls Rotary Club, by Albert V. Weigel, domestic trade commissioner of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Weigel took an optimistic view of business conditions, which he declared were on the up grade. He predicted they would speedily reverse, to a higher level of prosperity than at present.

**Urgo Reciprocally**

Finally the directors urged that the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce give the same reciprocal preference to Idaho products in its home city and vicinity that it requests that the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce give to goods made in Los Angeles.

Mr. Weigel announced that these representations would be presented in his report. He stated that he expects to spend part of today here in confirmation of visits with business men and others here and that the rest of the day will be spent in Puller, Huhl and Jerome and viewing beauty spots around the city.

Speaking on the subject of trade relations between the communities, he said: "I am here to find out whether we can sell you more merchandise and help you sell more of your products in Los Angeles. We believe in keeping Western dollars in the West."

"While there is talk about general business in trade, it is interesting to note that Los Angeles used more Idaho products in 1931 than in 1930 and more in 1931 than in 1929. Los Angeles used 2011 carloads of Idaho fruits in 1930 and 1568 in 1931. In 1931 the city was \$1,019,933 pounds of Idaho butter, 2,592,655 pounds of Idaho cheese, 246,953 pounds of Idaho dressed poultry, and almost 100,000 head of Idaho livestock, showing an increase over previous years. Why do you not take more goods you have an abundance of to Los Angeles? There are four and other products—California buys more Idaho food products than any other state. While no figures are available, I believe that you are buying a large amount from us. One of the results of the depression has been that people have learned that they can buy Western products, particularly Los
