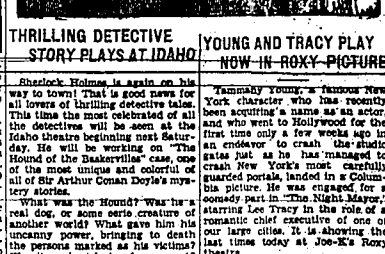

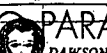

### \$60,000,000 VALUE OF TRACT FOR ALFALFA HAY

In terms of alfalfa hay, what is the value per acre of the Twin Falls tract? Since 1912, approximately 25 per cent of the normal area of the tract has been producing alfalfa. The period of 1923-1932, prices have ranged from \$10 to \$4 per ton, the average being approximately \$3.70. The normal yield is about four tons per acre.


