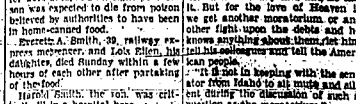
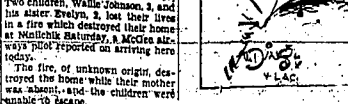
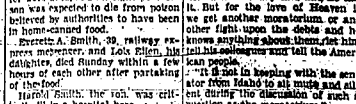

ANNUAL REVENUES EXCEED EXPENSE
Twin Falls Irrigation System Collects \$218,226; Spends \$190,634 in Year

With a maintenance charge of \$4 per acre, the lowest in the history, Twin Falls Canal company operated well within the limits of its income last year. An annual financial statement shows \$218,226.58 total receipts from all sources, with \$190,634.14 being total of all expenditures and \$27,592.44 balance on the right side of the ledger, is one of the most important reports that is brought to the company's stockholders at their annual meeting in Twin Falls today.

The net maintenance accounts receivable which amounted for last year to \$30,777.63, the financial statement lists as receipts for the year: \$6,174.84 sale of materials and supplies; \$3,818.28 receipts on water accounts receivable; miscellaneous cash receipts and \$20,784.51 water accounts receivable. Expense disbursements for the year totaled \$190,634.14, others listed as follows: Capital outlay, \$5,924.25; depreciation, \$931,240; miscellaneous (including \$494,814 for superintendence and \$451,827 for materials and supplies purchased and sold) \$13,899.44.

Major items of expense were \$49,707.21 for repairs, replacements and upkeep, including \$24,000 for the \$14,000,000 watermaster's department, including \$91,811.85 salaries of ditching "Drainage" and \$23,940.07, including \$12,033.78 spent on tunnels.

Defense in litigation instituted by the Twin Falls Land and Water company to compel sale of unclaimed canal stock out of the canal company, \$21,821 for general office expense, \$3,423.25.

Ware and yards, Twin Falls, Castelford, and Bull, \$25,811.46; other expense of water delivery; Jackson lake, normal flow, upper river re-vegetation, \$47,213; automobile expense, \$6,741.90; engineering department, \$2,690.19; general expense, \$17,820.

Capital outlay totaling \$524,225, includes \$280.38 for automobiles; \$17,820 for building and improvements; \$1,668.23 for machinery and equipment; \$462.50 for horses and trailers; \$1,122 for furniture and fixtures; and \$307.50 for small tools.

Inventory Drops
Out of a total of \$521,240 depreciation, \$504,324 is charged against machinery and equipment; \$27,925 against automobiles and trucks; \$29,290 against furniture and fixtures; \$335.39 against small tools and \$262.80 against livestock.

A complete balance sheet included in the statement lists \$97,819.75 cash resources at the close of 1932, as compared with \$33,430.25 at the close of 1931. Cash in closed banks at the end of last year totaled \$174,741.46, as compared with \$102,000 at the end of the preceding year. Cash resources include \$74,292 certificates of deposit in Twin Falls and Bull banks payable in annual installments during the next three years.

The inventory account shows a reduction of \$26,242.25 from \$129,000 in 1931 to \$102,757.75 in 1932. No petty accounts are listed as accounts receivable at the close of last year, and maintenance accounts receivable show a reduction of \$1,190.28 from \$2,380.56 in 1931 to \$1,190.28 in 1932.

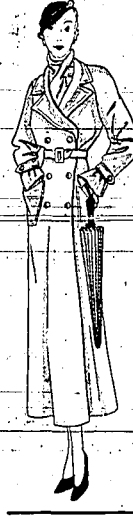
