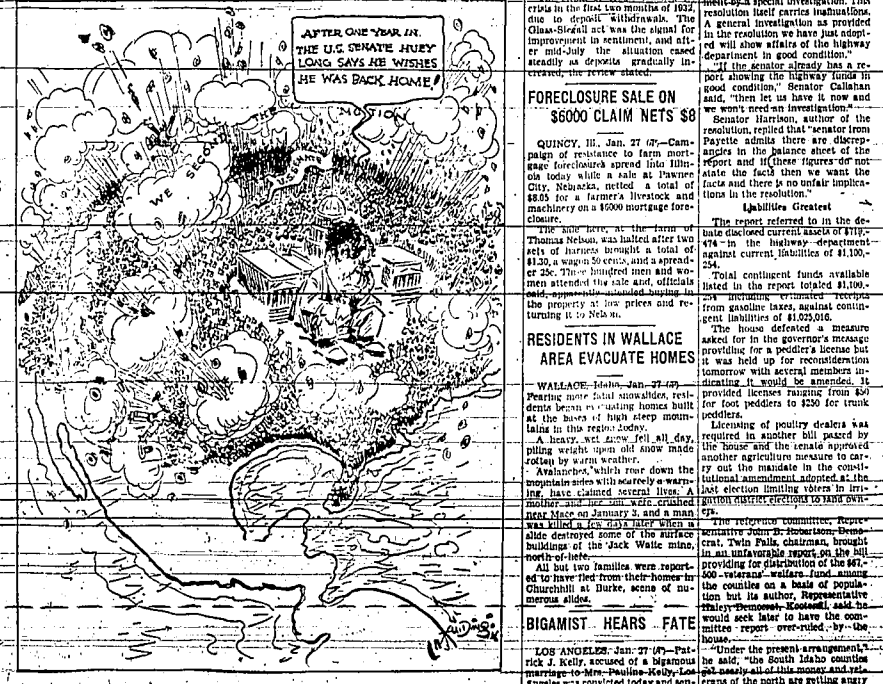

TEST OF BLOOD FIGURES IN TRIAL

Physician and Bacteriologists Find Evidence Exonerating Foster Father

State's attorney, in dealing with the question of baby's natural use testimony based on blood tests at a criminal trial in the district court yesterday.

The witness would not say that paternity could be definitely determined by means of blood tests.

STORM BLOCKADES THREE HIGHWAYS

Twin Falls District Escapes Snow and Wind That Closes Traffic Outlets

Twin Falls and immediate vicinity escaped entry of a blizzard and windstorm last night which yesterday had blocked Highway 15 in three directions.

Road to the west was blocked only late in the afternoon by deep drifts between Filer and Buhl with heavy snow covering the highway between Cedar and Buhl.
