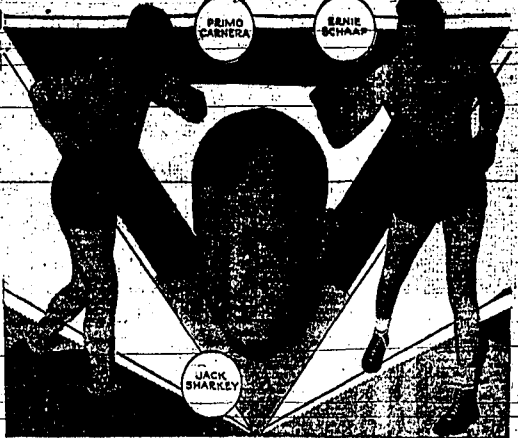

PLOWS GOVERNORS REOPENING ROADS Twin Falls Country In Grip of Low Temperature Digs Way Out of Drifts

Twin Falls county, continuing in the grip of cold weather following Monday's blizzard with a low temperature mark yesterday of 10 below zero, was still engaged last evening in the task of reopening roads and highways from the storm.

The Old Oregon Trail east-end highway was closed yesterday without a word of traffic was resumed over the road to the north, but the highway to the south remained open.

No more snow fell yesterday, but the day was cloudy. Twin Falls highway district plows continuing yesterday the work of clearing roads that they began early Monday night had pretty well opened up roads about Twin Falls and Kimberly, and were moving late yesterday into the gorge about the vicinity of Haxson.

The first motor bus was seen about 10 o'clock last evening and three hours later a westbound stage arrived from Pocatello.

Motor stage service was hardly re-established, though, before it was again closed by a blizzard which struck the Pocatello area shortly before midnight, so that it was closed here but it was transferred from this stage to the train this morning, unless the storm should return so that the road can be reopened.

Drifts that the storm piled up Monday night were being removed by the movement of school buses and west-bound stages.

It was reported that the last of the contingent of nearly 700 Twin Falls students and their parents who came to the city from their homes was delivered at class rooms here.

The mail stage was turned back was unable to cover its route Monday and yesterday it is being carried by a motor stage.

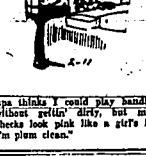

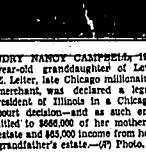
