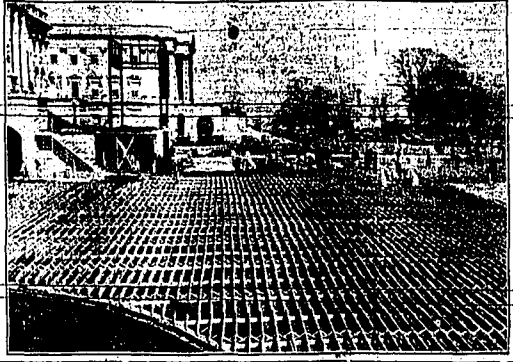

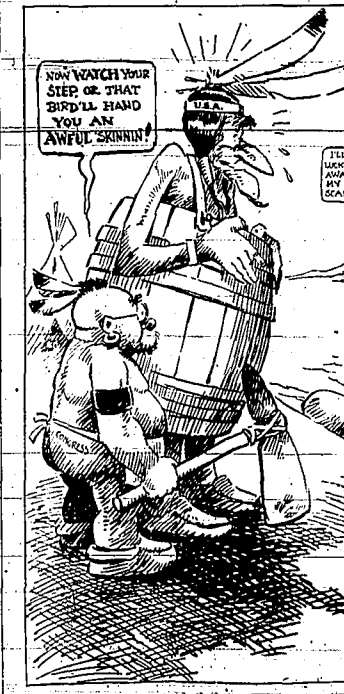

# "Babe" Ruth Delays Further Discussion Of 1933 Contract

## Sluggish Refuses To Take Part In Any Exhibitions

Risk of Injury Before Name Appears on Papers Leads "Bambino" to Fix Role on Pre-Season Activities

NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—It may be only full month before "Babe" Ruth goes to work in his new outfit of reaching a compromise on his 1933 salary with the Yankees, but he is taking the time to make his preparations for going South tomorrow with his family, the big slugger made clear by a statement today that he would not be signing a new contract.

The "Babe" made up his mind on the important point years ago, when he did not put his name on the dotted line day before the opening exhibition game. He had changed it, for the reason he believed it would be entirely too great a risk to be taken by him to sign an exhibition game and had not signed any contract, he asked the manager to think they had better offer me then?

This year the Yankees start their competition in the "Circuit" league against the Boston Braves at St. Petersburg, March 10, so that there was time to think they had better boys to speculate on just how much they would be able to do.

The Yankees leave tomorrow by train for Jacksonville, where they will motor to St. Petersburg Friday.

Judge Emil F. Puentes, president of the Boston Braves, paid a visit to the New York Giants today without discussion of the contract.

The first "variety" regular to sign a Yankee contract so far, outside the battery department, is Joe Berrill, the veteran Alabama slugger, who whose comeback played a big part in the success of the world champion team last year.
