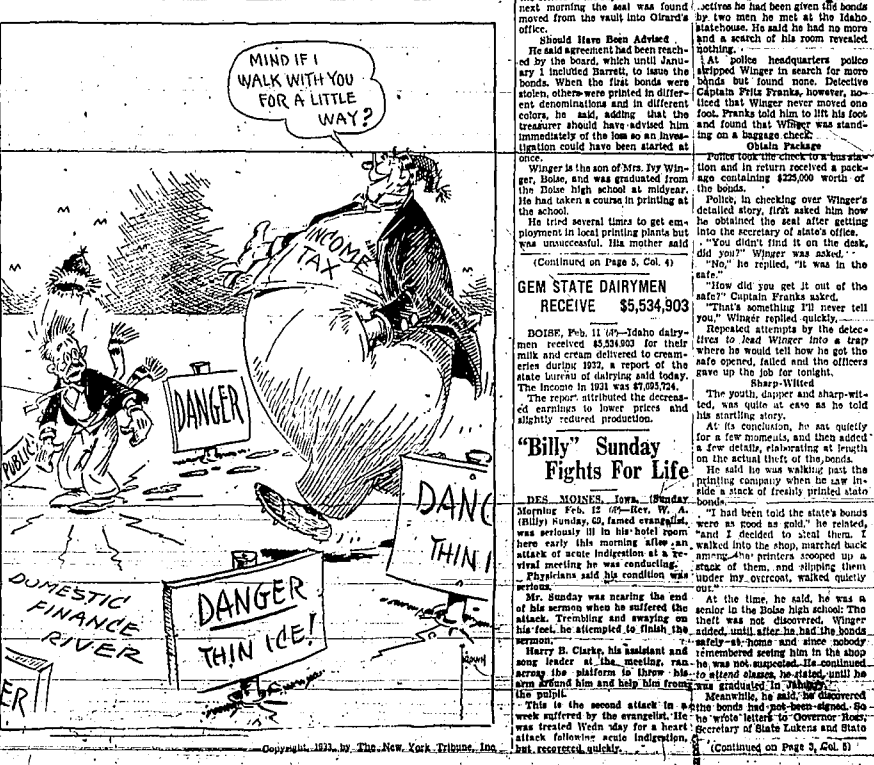

BUSINESS LEADER DIES IN NEW YORK

One of Great Romances of American Industry Ends With John D. Ryan's Death

NEW YORK, Feb. 11 (AP)—One of the greatest romances of American business ended today with the sudden death of John D. Ryan.

Starting his career as a clerk and traveling salesman, Ryan ended as chairman of the Anaconda Copper and Company, head of several subsidiaries, director of several utility companies, of the National City Bank of New York and the Post-Telegraph and Cable Corporation.

He was 68 years old and had been ill for only a day. He died in his home of heart disease.

Ryan's father and mother, John and Joanna Ryan, emigrated from Ireland and settled in Michigan in 1847.

His first wife was Mrs. Mary Ryan. She was killed in an automobile accident at Hancock, Michigan, at the age of 17.

One of his customers was Marcus Daly, who was then building up the Anaconda Copper Mine in Montana.

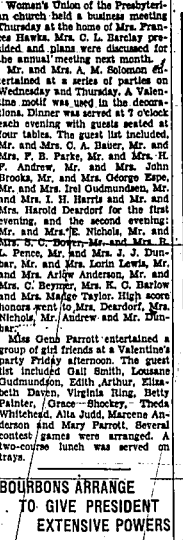

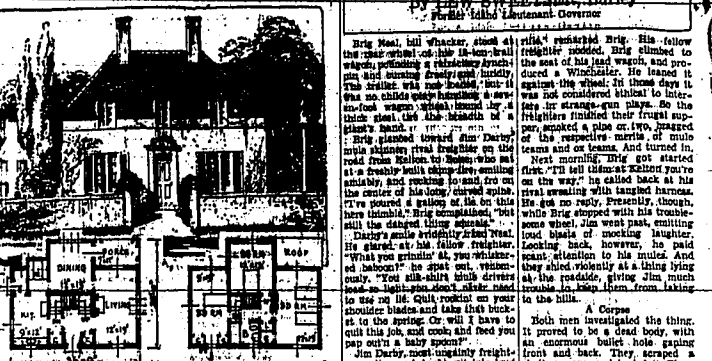

TAXPAYERS' BUDGET AT INSTITUTIONS IN ECONOMIC WOE

Noxious Weeds Five Survivors Under Fire at League Meeting in Twin Falls

Twin Falls county bureau of noxious weed control was the only one of five of the county's institutions to survive a withering financial meeting of 200 persons convened in the Odd Fellows hall in Twin Falls yesterday afternoon under the auspices of the Twin Falls County Taxpayers' League, in a campaign for drastic retrenchment in public expenditures.

The county general hospital, county health unit, county corrections and county pension all came under the ban of the assembled taxpayers, and approval of the recommendation for maintenance of the weeds bureau was voted by the narrowest of margins.

There was one of a group of similar meetings scheduled to be held simultaneously in all of the county divisions, at Buhl, Pocatello, Burley, and Hansen. Each of these meetings was held in the afternoon, and the Twin Falls hearing beginning here Monday on the county 1933 tax budget.

Extends Scope

The Twin Falls meeting included more than county expenditures in its purview. It called for a substantial reduction of school expenses, and recommended elimination of all highway district districts for 1933.

Draws Fees

The discussion of the bureau of noxious weed control drew fire from several quarters. The committee recommended maintenance of the weed bureau and after a lively debate, was approved by a standing vote, with the provision that the county commissioners be given the discretion that the annual levy be made a revolving fund, and be preserved from year to year.

For Economy's Sake

The committee report on the office of county agent, Charles W. Combs, recommended that the office be temporarily abolished for the sake of economy. The report and recommendation were accepted, without debate.
