MICHIGAN OFFICIALS FACE BANKING CRISIS

Governor's Proclamation Closes All Financial Houses for Eight Days

DETROIT, Feb. 16.—A speedy termination of the "acute financial emergency" which caused the "warning" to order an eight-day closing of Michigan's banks was sought tonight, as a result of a rash of citizens' outbreaks.

Officers of the Detroit Clearing House Association were announced a plan which will permit depositors to withdraw not in excess of \$100 from their accounts Thursday, thereby releasing \$25,000,000 to citizens affected by the holiday.

This affects Detroit only, although it was regarded as likely that state banks would follow suit.

"I do not expect there will be as much embarrassment over the holiday as there was last year," the governor said. "It is merely an emergency to protect deposits pending the strengthening of the banking laws."
