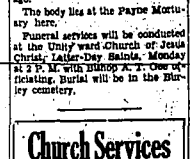

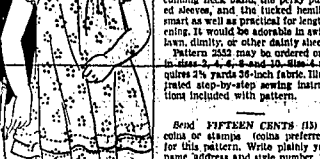

James J. Corbett, Conqueror Of Sullivan, Dies In Sleep

Close Associates Meet At Bedside Of Dying Athlete

Complication of Diseases Saps Former Heavyweight Champion's Strength and Death Comes at Age of 68

 NEW YORK, Feb. 18.—A pale, courageous "shadow" of the world's most famous prizefighter, the man who rocked the world with his knockout of John J. Sullivan 20 years ago—James J. Corbett—died in his sleep today at his suburban home in Bay Ridge, Long Island.

Death was due to a complication of diseases which had sapped the former heavyweight champion's strength for the past year and developed a fatal heart ailment three weeks ago.

Wistfully, a few hours before he died, his dark eyes opened and slowly searched the room where he had received the homage of the sporting world that day he was stricken.

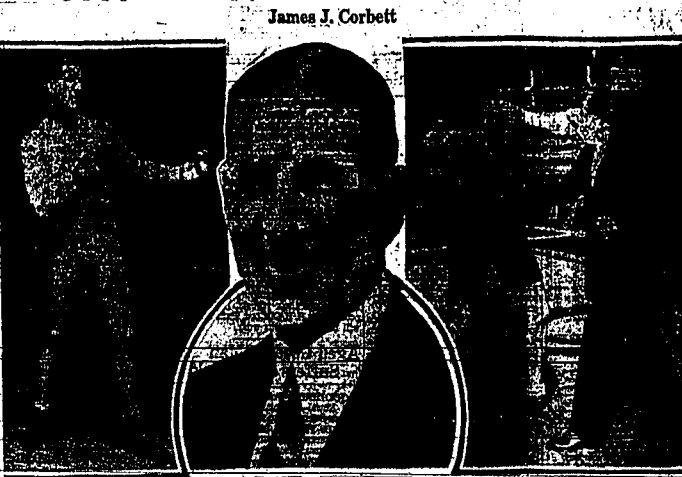
Corbett died at about 1:40 P. M. with a small group of close friends at the bedside and his wife, Mary, about him.

Corbett had received his last communion several days ago and his parish priest, Rev. John J. O'Connell, had administered the sacrament to him the last rites of the church.

The news of Corbett's death brought a spasm of grief to the world, from San Francisco, where he was born and first fought, to "Empire City," New York, where "Empire Joe" was first and perhaps greatest of all the heavyweight boxing champions, and a social and theatrical success long after he retired from the ring in 1922.

Not far from the Broadway he loved so well himself and that knew him for 30 years as one of the most striking actors, (his spouses will be paid for Corbett's memory at the funeral service Monday at 11 A. M. at St. Malachy's church, a block from the New Madison Square Garden.

Remarkable Career
 Corbett's death closed a remarkable career and removed another link connecting the highly developed pugilistic art of the past with the pugilistic art of the present. It was as an exponent of physical culture and scientific boxing, the revolutionary boxer of his time, that he went into his boxing.
