Mr. Matsumoto is credited to be in Tokyo.

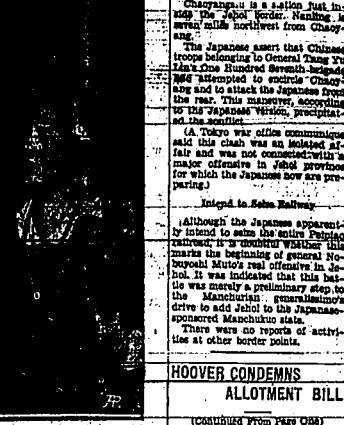

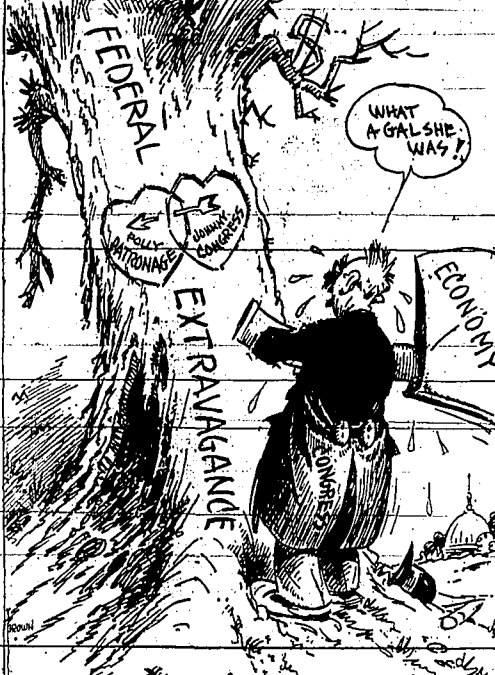

CINCINNATI, Feb. 20.—The less said about Jim Corbett's three-round knockout of Charley Mitchell, the better. Mitchell, known as "The Kid," was a former champion and was known to Sullivan down and fought him 30 rounds to a draw in Cincinnati, France, the better for all concerned.

"At the time Mitchell was no more than 160 pounds. He had hit Corbett bitterly and 'Pompadour' Jim felt just as keenly about the fight as Mitchell. So vicious was their enmity that there were questionable tactics on both sides.
