ROOSEVELT URGES SPEEDY DECISION ON FARM MEASURE

(Continued From Page One) Farmers are "unprecedented" and justify the trial of new methods. If the effort fails, it will be the first to admit it.

Immediately after receiving his special message congressional machinery was set to motion to assure early consideration of the measure of the house agriculture committee pending action by the house yesterday. Senate action was regarded as likely early next week.

Based on the recommendations of farm organization leaders, the measure would give extraordinary powers to Secretary Wallace to lease lands to remove them from production, to regulate markets and processors and to enter into agreements with packers, millers and other food manufacturers to control their output in an effort to force prices upward.

Provisions of the Smith cotton option contract plan, given a pocket veto by President Hoover, were incorporated into the measure. The modifications of the original domestic allotment plan. The commodities which are to be subject to such action are cotton, wheat, corn, hog, cattle, sheep, rice, tobacco, milk and poultry.

The measure authorizes a proceeding to provide funds to pay benefits to farmers in relation to acreage reduction; a tax on warehouse stocks and commodity futures contracts; a tax on the sale of such contracts at prices below domestic floor. The commodity bill would consist of amendments to the Agricultural Adjustment Act and other provisions relating to the same.

Secretary Wallace said he would also have a report on a 20 percent reduction in acreage of all crops covered by the act. It passed the house by a vote of 219 to 193. It is expected to be passed in the senate.

The bill, long and complicated, was described by the president as one which offers a "new and bold" method of dealing with the world crop surplus. It is expected to be passed in the senate.
