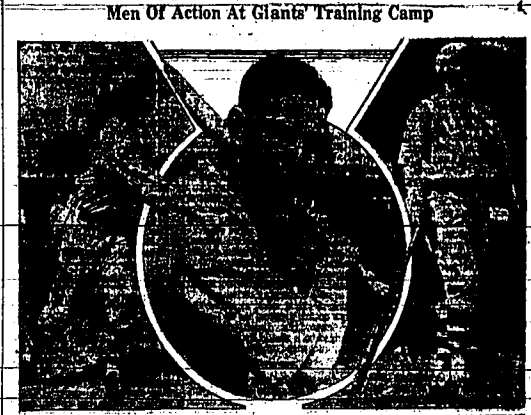

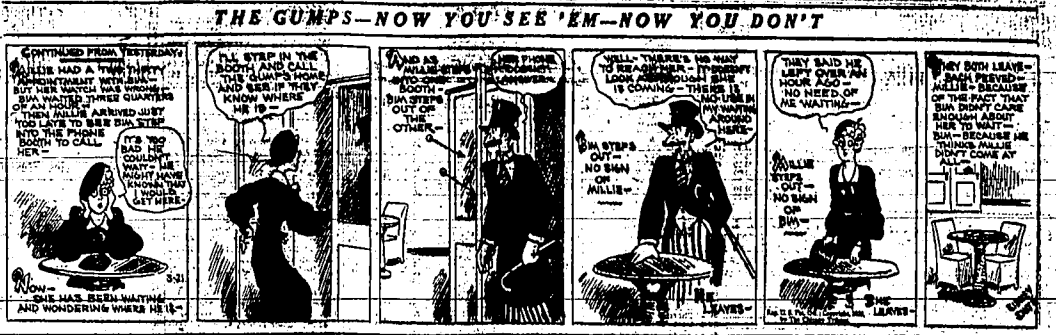

### COUNCIL'S VOTE PUTS MILK TRADE ON GRADE BASIS

#### Twin Falls Inspector Gets Regulatory Measure Designed to Assure Community of Pure Product

Effective next May 1, a new milk ordinance which Twin Falls city council passed by unanimous vote at a regular meeting last night, calls for grading of all milk and cream for sale in Twin Falls. Grades are to be determined by inspectors and are to be enforced by a score-of-one-of-five scale, all tending to assure a wholesome milk supply.

The ordinance as adopted, provides for A, B, C and D grades of milk. The fourth grade or white provision was made when the ordinance came up for final reading and adoption last night.

Another alteration in the ordinance was made when the ordinance was adopted last night providing that where a dairyman is dissatisfied with the inspector's grade or with an appeal to the state welfare department and the state welfare department is also dissatisfied, the appeal to be accepted by all parties as the proper basis for the grade.

A fee of \$1.00 is to be charged for dairymen's permits, which the ordinance requires for all milk producers. The ordinance also provides for suspension or cancellation for cause of a permit for failure to comply with the ordinance.

It took 35 minutes of steady reading and the ordinance was passed by a vote of 10-0. The ordinance covers more than 200 regulations.

**Milk Health Requirements**  
The director of health, director of Twin Falls county health unit, addressing the council before the final reading of the ordinance, suggested the adoption as an effective means of safeguarding the community.

**Dr. T. Reed, lately appointed Twin Falls meat and dairy inspector, who took an active part in drafting of the new ordinance, followed the reading closely, and when the ordinance was passed, he assured the council that he can and will enforce the provisions strictly.**

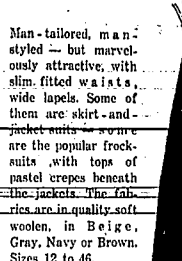

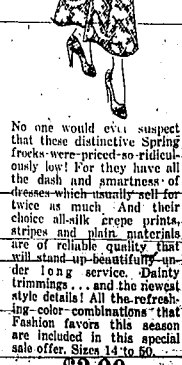
