SENATE PROBES DELAY IN ACTION AGAINST BANKER

Counsel for Committee Declines to Scrutinize Circumstances in Prosecution of Joseph W. Harriman

(By The Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, March 23.—A delay in the prosecution of Joseph W. Harriman, resigned chairman of the National Bank and Trust company, was announced today by counsel for the senate committee whose inquiry into stock market practices already has resulted in far-reaching disclosure of the effect caused from Ferdinand Pecora. It was announced that the committee will not hold a public hearing on the matter until the fall within the scope of the senate resolution authorizing the committee's activities.

Attorney General Cummings in Washington said the prosecution of Harriman was charged with making "false entries" in the account of the stock market. William D. Mitchell, attorney general in the Hoover administration.

Declines Administration

Mitchell said at Charleston, South Carolina, however, that the case had not been through his attention while he was in charge of the department. He said he had no knowledge of any delay being ordered by the justice department.

Cummings explained that "apparently the impression was that the delicate financial situation at the time brought the judgment that prosecution might be well deferred."
