All 175 state banks in California had estimated deposits of \$11,000,000, 538 banks in New York have been open and have deposits placed by the superintendent of bank offices at \$1,500,000,000.

72 Percent Deposited In Chicago Federal Reserve District was estimated that of the funds now in member banks, 72 per cent are unrestricted, 24 per cent are in banks which are in the hands of conservators, and 3 per cent in banks on which no action has been taken.

On March 1 the 387 member banks in the Boston federal reserve district have had deposits of \$1,219,410,000, while today the total deposits in the 307 unrestricted member banks were \$1,219,410,000.

None of the survey figures include banks which were closed or in process of liquidation before the holding of a public hearing.

Some overlapping occurs between the state and federal reserve districts. The typical member state banks in New York are also member banks in the New York reserve district.

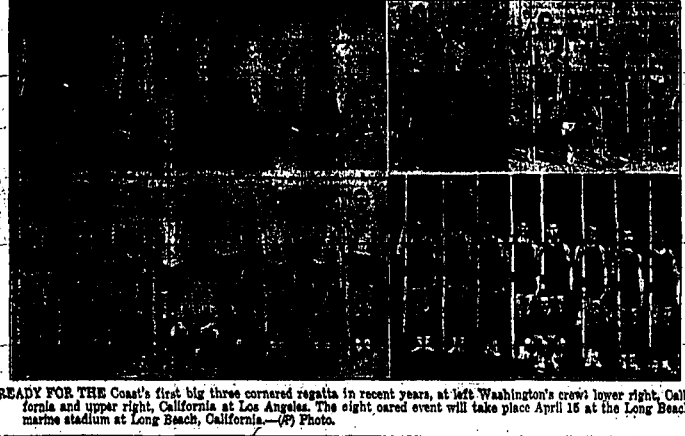

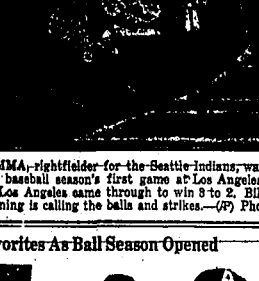

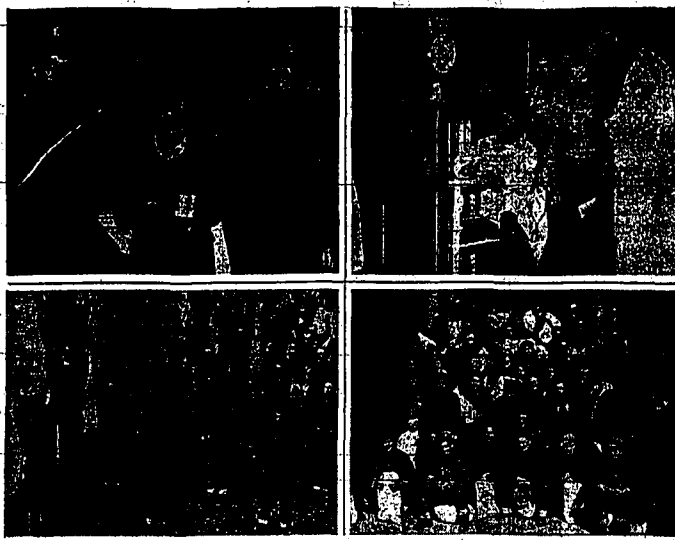

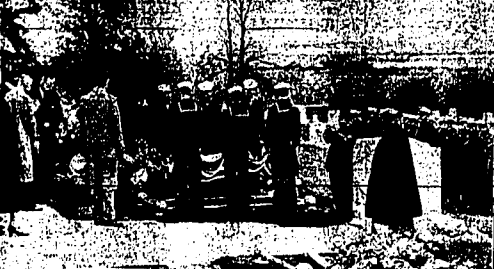
