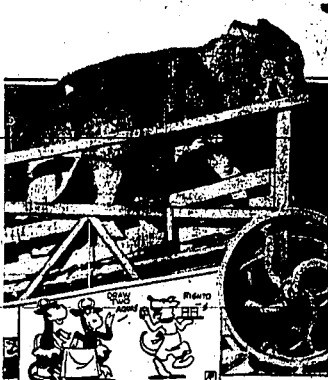

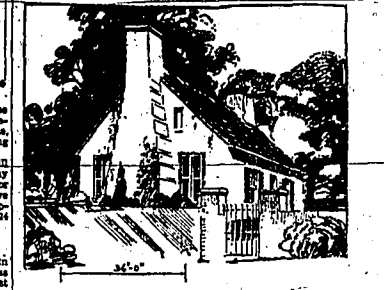

LOCAL COMMODITY LIST CONTINUES STEADY ADVANCE Butterfat Leads With Two 1-Cent Increases; Wheat Responds to Stimulus And Beans Hold Firm

Steady advances continued in Twin Falls market quotations and although some commodities were absent during the past week, there was likewise an absence of any general downward tendency. It is believed that commodities advancing in price earlier in the season had built their prices up to a point where they could be attributed to good consumer demand rather than speculation.

This was notably true in bean prices, which advanced \$1.40 for number 1 Great Northern, and \$1.40 for number 2, setting a high peak for the season. They held their price steadily throughout the week and closed Saturday with five dealers quoting.

What advance was recorded during the week was led by butterfat, which opened at 23 cents per pound and took two jumps of 1 cent each to end the week at 25 cents. Local retail prices for butterfat were reported with a 1/2 cent advance, to 10 cents and 20 cents.

Wheat responded to a seasonal stimulus, which was in evidence yesterday on both Federation and Dicklow, to close the week at 23 and 26 cents a bushel, respectively. Poultry gained 1 cent, heavy hens closing at 10 cents and light hens at 7 cents.

The advent of Easter brought special prices on all fresh produce. In fact, at all retail markets, fresh produce prices were selling at 10 to 15 cents per pound, and most of the produce was in good condition or in the near neighborhood. Livestock quotations held steady, recording no change.

Notable in many stores were Easter bunnies—the chocolate variety, which are commonly seen, but live ones. Most of them were white, and half to three-quarters matured. The most common price was 10 cents each.

Three-spined oranges, which are in season, were selling at 10 cents a dozen, with some going down to two dozen for 25 cents. These were used for leaders at some stores, and were in good condition. Other grades, or the regular supply, recorded little change. Some were selling at 10 cents a dozen, and as high as 20 cents for fancy.

Bean shipments were about normal, with a few extra cars being shipped. It is expected that the influence of lower stage supplies, shipments dropped off heavily 20 per cent over the week, and 25 cars sent out during the week.
