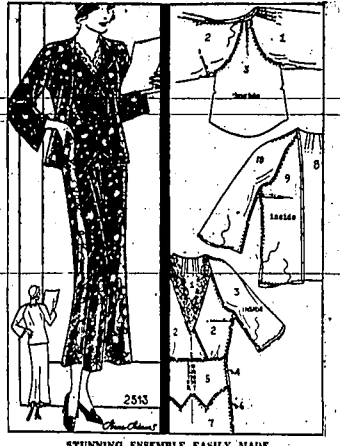

The records show that the police investigated this number of complaints during the year. But if we as a police continue to demand of our police force the same degree of activity which we have had, the same attention to our complaints and the same high standard of law enforcement which we have given used in Twin Falls, we might as well make up our minds that we are not going to get off with very much less expense than is now being incurred.

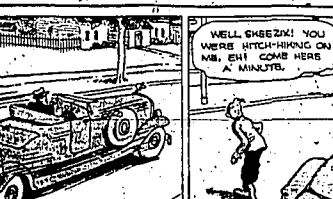
