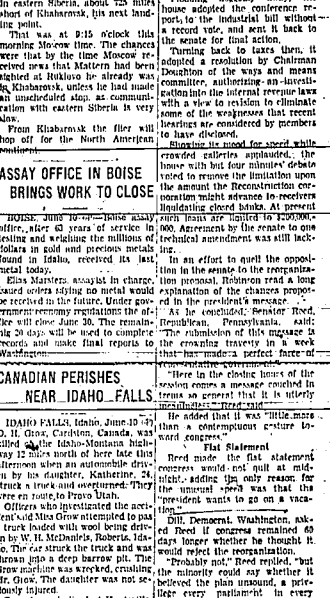

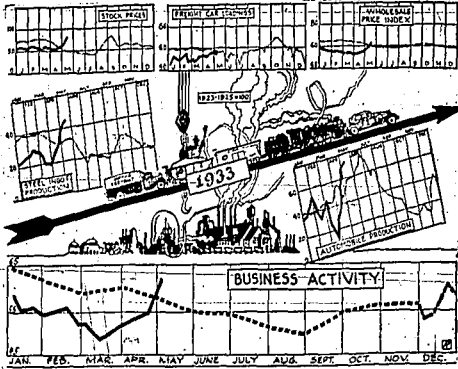


Charted Business Lines Carry Message Of Optimism

HEAVY INDUSTRIES LEAD IMPROVEMENT AFTER LONG SLUMP

Basic Hope That Present Recovery Points to Return Of Normalcy Lies in Trend Of All Commodity Prices

By J. BRACKETT (Associated Press Staff Writer) NEW YORK, June 10.—The heavy downward lines of 1932 on charts showing business conditions are being pierced by the upward lines of 1933—the first time that many major statistical indicators have been able to exceed the previous year's record.



Statisticians, working over charts and figures that tell the story of economic conditions, are smiling as the curves they plot move upward and cross the lines of a year ago. The charts above show the gain in a number of activities, the black lines being 1933 and dotted lines 1932. The chart at the bottom is for business in general.

IDAHO ATTORNEY RULES ON WARRANT QUESTION

BOISE, June 10 (AP)—If warrants issued by the county between the second Monday of January and the second Monday of April are not paid, a special levy may be assessed in September of the same year to pay them, an opinion issued today from the office of the attorney general stated.

Statements of previous years unpaid at that time may also be provided for in the warrant redemption fund levy, he said, and these might be paid off first, in the order of their registration. All stipulates in any funds will go to the warrant redemption fund at the end of the fiscal year, on order of the county commissioners. The opinion stated, adding that this fund also must get all payments of delinquent tax receipts, he ruled, cannot be used for current expenses as long as there are any outstanding warrants.

FIGHT ON LICENSE

District Court Ruling Reopens Way to Test of Farm Produce Measure

Application to test validity of Idaho's farm produce dealers license law started on its way to the state supreme court when Judge W. A. Dabcock in the district court here yesterday, granted a motion to set aside judgment and reopen the injunction suit which W. C. Hall, attorney for the dealers, started against the state commissioner of agriculture, last August.

Hall's attorneys, Chapman and Chapman, Twin Falls, also were granted permission to amend his complaint to allege that surely commission would apply for bond under this law to show financial worth of at least \$30,000.

In his original complaint, Hall asked for an injunction restraining the commissioner of agriculture from prosecuting him in criminal action for failure to secure license and bond. He asserted that he is a cash dealer in farm produce, and that the seizure of him "is a seizure and forfeiture of his business and livelihood."

The attorney general, representing the state, yesterday reported that he would not stand in the way of trial of the case, but on these matters.

It was understood that produce dealers throughout the state are interested in securing a determination of these issues.

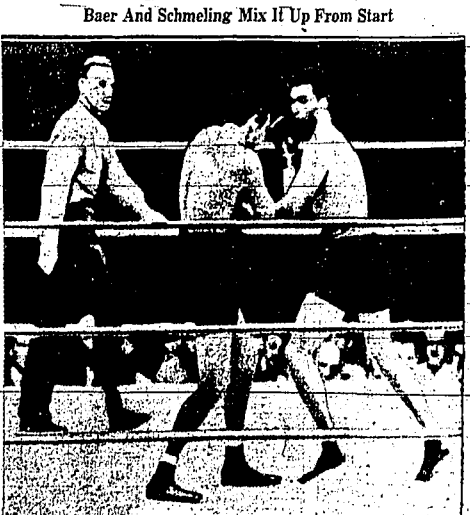
