TWIN FALLS FIXES LICENSE SCHEDULE FOR BEER TRAFFIC

Council Takes Action When Word Comes of Admission Of 3.2 Brew to Idaho; Puts Ban on Screens

Twin Falls will collect beer license fees from manufacturers and these classes of dealers—wholesalers, dispensers and retailers—under provisions of an ordinance which the city council adopted on motion by Mayor Duncan Johnson at an adjourned meeting last evening.

Adoption of the ordinance, which had been drafted for council consideration at a private conference held at the city hall before the council meeting, had been postponed for three days until after the governor's signature of the 3.2 law.

License fees to be paid annually, as follows: Retailers, \$12.00; dispensers, \$30 each; wholesalers, \$50 each. Dispensers were designated as persons selling beer to retailers from truck load, or carried or otherwise (as distinguished from wholesalers) with established places of business in Twin Falls.

Applications for beer manufacturers and dealers licenses will be received immediately. It was announced that no application for manufacturer's license, and five for retailers' licenses have been received.

Call for Clear View

The ordinance which provides for the collection of license fees, and the manner in which they shall be collected, is as follows: Section 1. That the city of Twin Falls hereby fixes the license fees to be paid by persons engaged in the business of selling beer to retailers from truck load, or carried or otherwise (as distinguished from wholesalers) with established places of business in Twin Falls.

Section 2. That the applicant is not to be considered of any felony or any crime involving moral turpitude.

Section 3. That the applicant agrees to abide by and comply with the terms and conditions of this ordinance.

Section 4. That the applicant agrees to furnish information as follows: a. Name and residence of applicant; b. A legal description of the room or building in which business shall be conducted; c. That the applicant is a good moral character and is over the age of 21 years; d. That the applicant has not been convicted of any felony or any crime involving moral turpitude.


