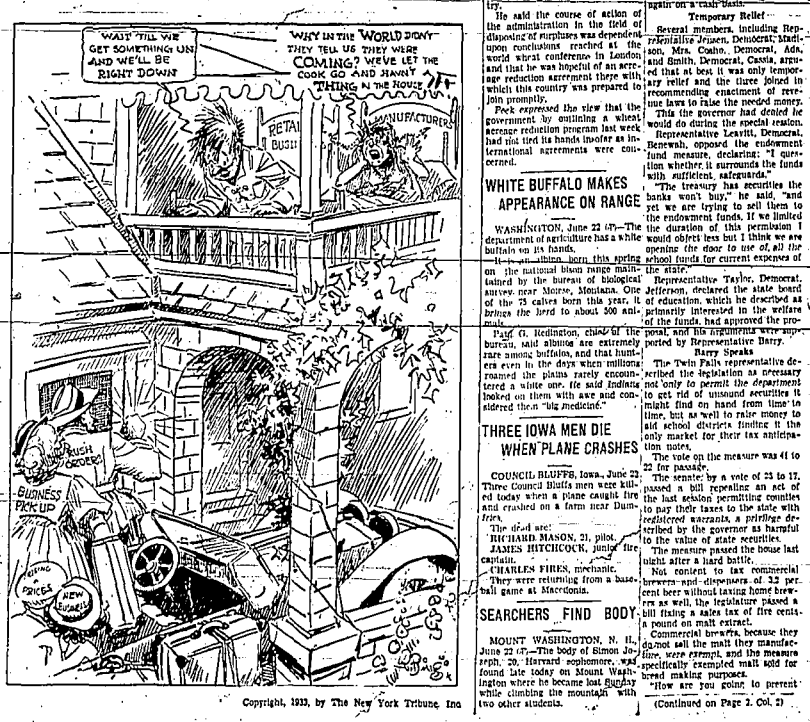

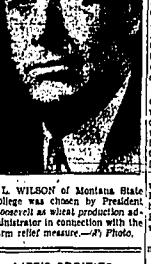

Scientist Peers Into 'Davy Jones Locker' and Finds It's Tomb-Like

(CHICAGO, June 22 (AP)—A famous scientist has peered into "Davy Jones' Locker" and found it to be a virtually a tomb.

The man who explored "Davy Jones' Locker" with the help of scientific research is Dr. August Krogh, Danish biologist, and his expedition was the first of its kind since the first voyage before the American Association of the Advancement of Science.

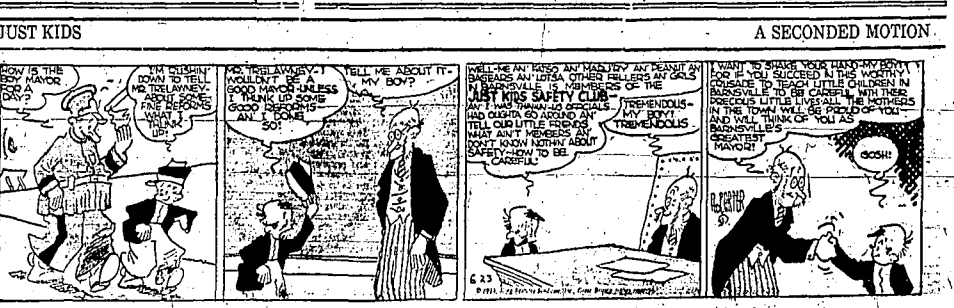
