Farm Plan Entitles Idaho Wheat Growers To \$1,250,000

ECONOMIST REPORTS ESTIMATE OF CASH BENEFIT UNDER ACT

Dr. Paul A. Eke of University at Moscow Explains New Measure Fixing Payments On Next Year's Crop

MOSCOW, June 30 (Special to The News)—Idaho wheat growers will be entitled to receive approximately \$1,250,000 of the cash benefit which is estimated will be paid on the 1937 wheat crop under the new wheat price support act. The opinion of Dr. Paul A. Eke, economist with the University of Idaho who has just completed a study of the act, is that a practically 100 per cent crop-upon payment will be made to the farmer in September or October to farmers who have not yet received their share, according to announcement from the department of agriculture. This payment will amount to approximately two-thirds of the total payment on the 1934 crop.

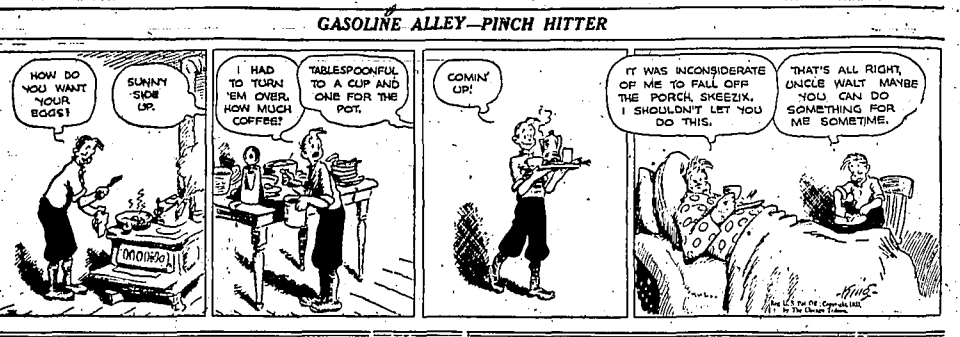
