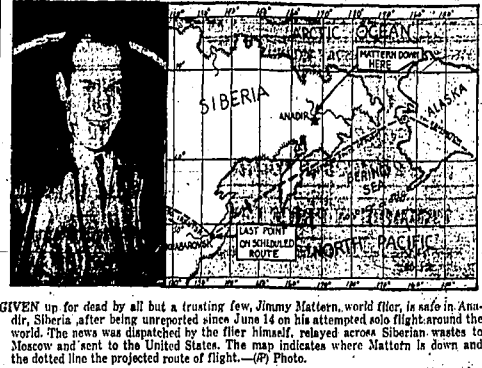

The average output for the middle year, 1924 to 1926, inclusive, was 100 per cent of normal. The West has the poorest crop outlook in the country. Their oldest harvest eliminated on thousands of farms the operation of which will have little or no grain to sell, will have the most general advance in farm prices.

After reading the report, Wallace said in his opinion the crop outlook indicated greater opportunity rather than less for his program for reducing the output of farms.

Low Slight of Farms "The exceedingly short grain crop this year, while it solves to some extent the surplus carryover from last year, can easily cause both farmers and people to lose sight of the fact that we are still planting more acres to grain than can be consumed in this country or sold at a fair price abroad," Wallace said.

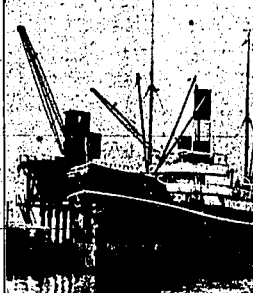

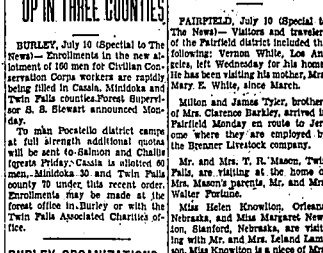
