to a six-week 40-hour week for any one week during the period, no work over exceeding eight hours in any one day.

Exempt From Provision

Exempt from both preceding provisions are establishments in towns of less than 2500 population, part of a large trade area, which employ not more than two persons.

Pharmacists and professional workers, managerial or executive employees now receiving more than \$15 per week, emergency and repair workers, and other special cases also would be exempt.

A flat \$15-a-week minimum pay level in any city over 500,000 population was prescribed. Below that level the minimum is \$14.50 for a quarter million down to \$10.00 for a city of 10,000. While in communities below that employers must agree to increase all wages by not less than 10 percent, provided this shall not require wages in excess of \$12 a week. Factors and agents shall receive not less than 40 cents per hour unless the rate for that work on July 15, 1932, was less than 40 cents an hour, with, in no case a less rate than 30 cents per hour.

The agreement also would pledge signers to use for employers to illustrate the spirit and intent of the agreement which was defined as "to bring about a general increase of employment by a universal outgrowth of removal of obstructions to commerce, to shorten hours and to raise wages for the shorter week to a living basis."

Signers also must pledge not to raise prices of merchandise over the July 1 level by more than is made necessary by actual increased production, freight, and other costs, and they must pledge to refrain from taking profitable advantage of the economic situation.

Beans Brief Message

Each agreement form, as given out by Johnson bears at the top a brief message signed by the president and addressed to "Every Employer."

"This agreement is part of a nation-wide plan to raise wages, create employment, and thus increase purchasing power and restore confidence. For this reason I ask you, as an employer to do your part by signing this agreement."

"If it turns out that the general agreement bears unfairly on any group of employers, they can have that established out by presentation of their proposed code of fair competition."

The forms are to be delivered to employers of more than three employees all over the country. The post office department will have charge of the distribution.

Meanwhile the wide-fronted recovery endeavor brought new developments.

Committees of two brewers' associations agreed on writing into their code a provision for a 40-hour week as controlling or having an interest in retail and distributing firms. They are seeking a 40-hour week this year.

on exchanges to restore better times. It was said in semi-official circles that any action to close the exchanges that had been taken was voluntary and not by government request.

There was no immediate word from the administration about the stock market, but Senator Thomas, Democratic, Oklahoma, suggested that a code might be prescribed by the federal government for the control of such exchanges.

Will Not Hurtle

Those familiar with the views of President Roosevelt believed that if the market fluctuations endangered his recovery program, he would not hesitate to act firmly and speedily. 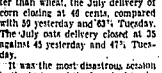

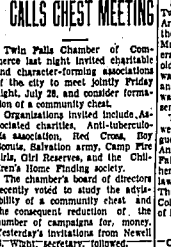
