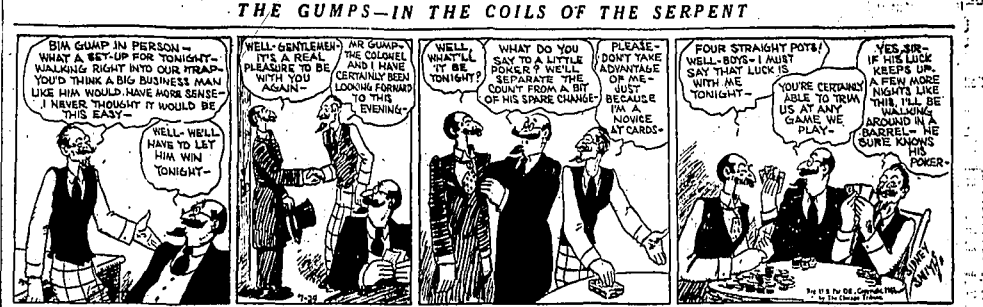

CLERKS MAKE NEW LISTS OF VOTERS

Attorney General's Qualified Calls for Compilation of Voters Last November

An opinion lately given by the attorney general has made necessary the compilation of new registration lists for the prohibition referendum election in Idaho next September 19, it was stated at Twin Falls county auditors office yesterday. Two young women clerks, employed at the auditors office for this work, will complete the list of some 11,000 names within the next week or 10 days, it was stated. These lists will be delivered to registrars in Twin Falls county 27 voting precincts, for registration of the voters for the coming year.

"This is the general opinion, it was stated, held that only clerks who had voted in the general election last November were qualified to vote in the prohibition referendum, without registering again."

Under the new law, however, Twin Falls county attorney, it was stated by the auditor's office, the law that all qualified voters would be entitled to vote in the referendum election, to mean that all who were qualified and registered for the November general election would not be required to register again. In that case the already compiled lists of voters registered for the November election would have sufficed.

Record-breaking fluctuations of prices in the national grain markets during the week which ended last night were reflected in South Central Idaho by a rise in Twin Falls cash wheat during the early part of the week to the highest recorded here in 38 months, and by a decline of 27 cents in two days to a top of 50 cents at the market closed yesterday last night.

LAMB POOL DISTRIBUTES \$3788 AMONG GROWERS

Wheat closed last Saturday night at a top of 73 cents, rose 2 cents Monday and 2 cents Tuesday to 77 cents, the highest paid here since 1919.

The market began its frenzied decline Wednesday and on that day cash wheat fell to a top of 67 cents in Twin Falls and on Thursday dropped 17 cents to 50 cents, which was maintained Friday and Saturday while mill buyers and farmers waited developments in the east.

Beans dealers were offering a top of \$5.50 for number 1 Great Northern when the preceding week closed. Two dealers offered \$5.50 Monday, three bid the year's top of \$5.00 on Tuesday, and three other dealers joined the bidding on Wednesday. It was the highest bid here since Jan 7, 1931. The \$5.00 price was maintained by two dealers Thursday while uncertainties mounted with falling markets elsewhere. It was the highest bid that flour Friday. All dropped out of the market yesterday.
