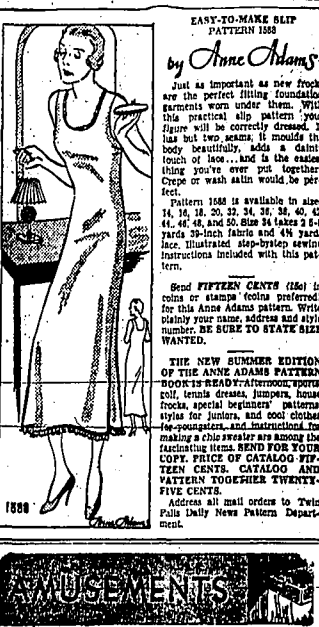

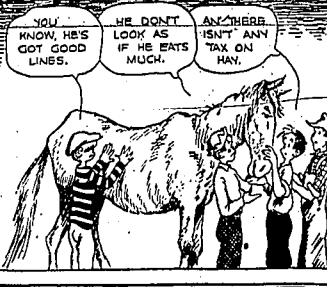

Prices Move Erratically, But Grains Recover Most Of Declines Of 3 Cents

By GILES L. FINDLEY (Associated Press Market Writer) CHICAGO, Aug. 21 (AP)—Grain prices moved erratically today but wheat and corn recovered the major portion of a 3-cent decline before the close.

Private reports from Russia that imminent weather indicated harvest delay and a smaller export from Argentina, telling of urgent need for wheat, helped to bring the International Institute of Rome of a shortage in world wheat and a consequent advance in prices was also reported by the International Institute of Rome.

Wheat prices advanced moderately at the opening and carried all other grains along, but a wave of selling, attributed to houses with Eastern connections, soon drove prices down 2 cents a bushel, and corn, oats and barley lagged along.
