IDAHO COMMISSIONER FIXES INTEREST RATE

BOISE, Aug. 31 (AP)—The Idaho commissioner of finance today set the rate of interest on public bonds to pay on public deposits with a compromise between the Oregon and Utah rates.

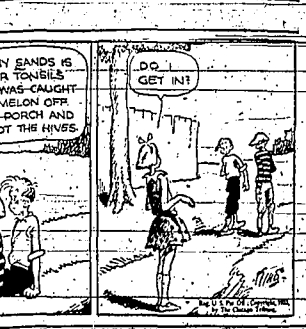
