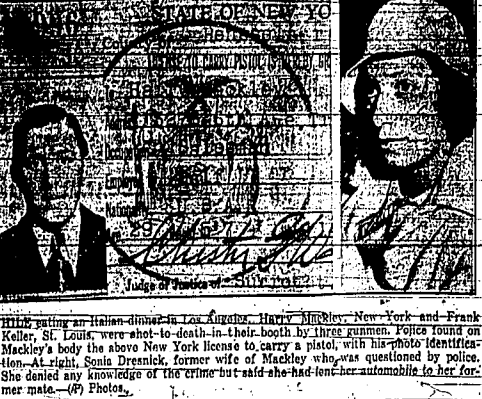

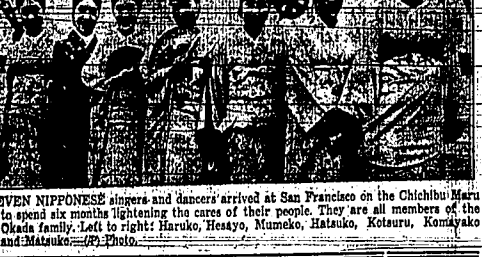

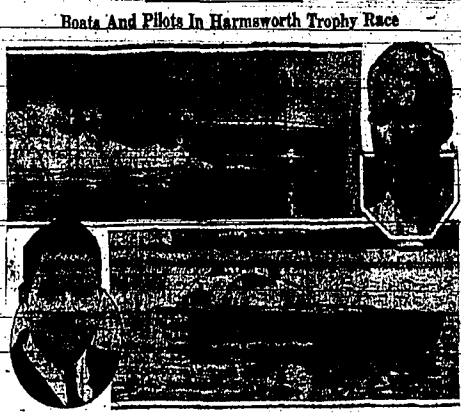

TWIN FALLS, Sept. 6.—(AP)—A 40-horsepower speedboat, piloted by a 22-year-old American, won the world's speedboat championship today for the eighth year when he defeated Hubert Scott-Paine, British challenger, today in the second race of the 1933 international trophy series.
