IDAHO'S COLLEGIANS RETURN TO CAMPUS

Indications at Moscow Reint To Possible Slight Gain In University Enrollment

MOSCO, Sept. 9 (Special to the News)—Another vacation over, Idaho's collegians go to the mountains and skiing back to the campus.

The 1933-34 academic year for the University of Idaho officially opens with freshmen day Monday and Tuesday, September 18 and 19, during which time new students are given intensive instruction on the admission procedure and regulations that will follow.

The first freshmen assembly will be held Monday morning with President M. O. Neale presiding. It should be held during the succeeding two days, culminating in the election of officers and organization of the class Wednesday.

While it is not too early to draw definite conclusions from the indications for the coming year, indications point to a registration substantially the same as last year. The slight increase in the number of women attending classes may be offset, however, by a decline in the number of men students. What the final result will be in the case of men will depend upon developments in the employment situation, also many of the old students have indicated a desire to remain out of college a year and re-occupy their finances.

More favorable economic conditions, however, would result in a sharp increase in the number of requests for information about college courses during the past summer has been the largest in years. Another important factor is the fact that many students are returning to college with a higher percentage indicated a desire to continue their education. This is especially so in the case of the women's group.

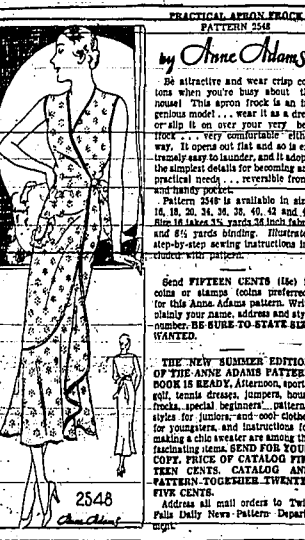

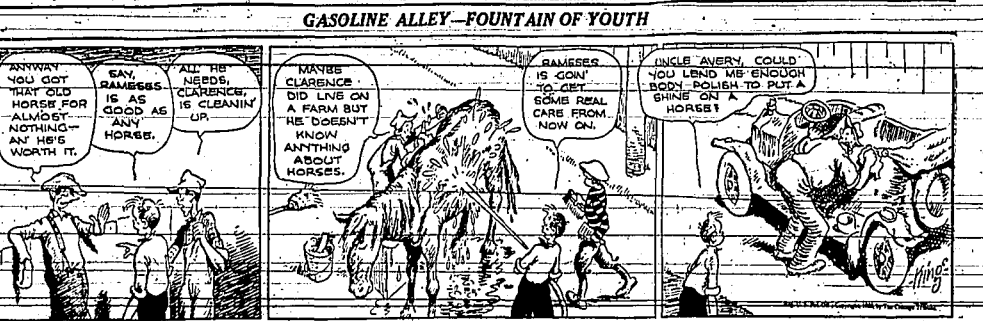

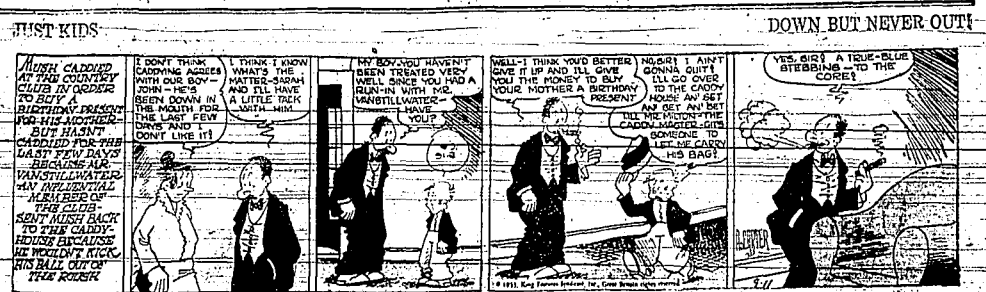
