### NRA PUBLICITY WARNS AGAINST PRICE FIXING

PORTLAND, Sept. 12 (Special to The News) — Price-fixing by local trade associations is being warned against by the National Recovery Administration in a bulletin from the NRA office in Portland.

Reports that several trade associations in the Oregon and Idaho cities were manipulating prices called forth adverse comment by members of the national recovery board today.

"The president's re-employment agreement gives authority for price-fixing," declared Frank Messenger, district manager of the national recovery board in Oregon and Idaho. "Merchants who use this kind of an excuse to fix prices, with a view to raising them, are in violation of the act."

Without Authority

Board members of the recovery board section, national recovery administration, Washington, District of Columbia, advised today that they do not have authority to set prices by mutual agreement under the Blue Eagle code.

Section 1 of the employment agreement, which governs prices, reads: "It is the policy of the board to increase the price of any merchandise and the rate thereof over the price of July 1, 1933, by more than a trade necessary for actual increase in production, replacement or invoice costs of merchandise since July 1, 1933, or by any other cost resulting from action taken pursuant to the agricultural adjustment act and to any other act necessary to give full effect to the provisions of said act."

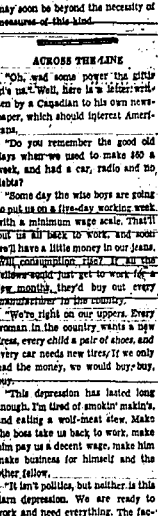

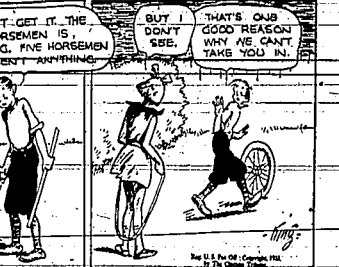
