MAIL SUBSIDIES START SCANDALS

Senator Black Places In Record Reports Showing Huge Sums Paid for Mail

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 (AP)—Ocean mail subsidies paid to the Exporters' association for the transportation paid the shipping board in 18 months was disclosed today in a Senate investigation.

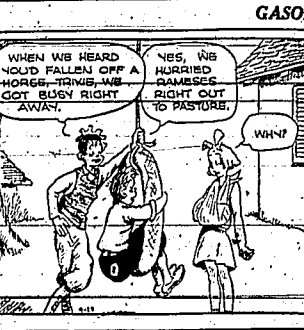

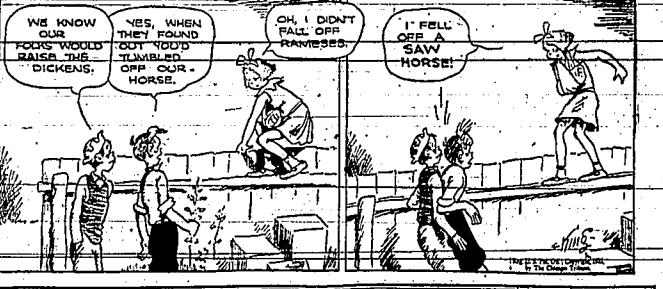

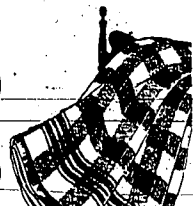
