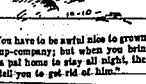

WHEAT REPORT SHOWS 650 WHEAT CONTRACTS

SURLEY, Oct. 11 (Special to The News)—With the closing of time set for signatures to wheat reduction contracts Saturday, more than 650 farmers operating 85,000 acres of wheat lands have accepted the contracts. This is about 50 per cent of farmers growing wheat, with 80 per cent of the Canada county wheat lands. 


