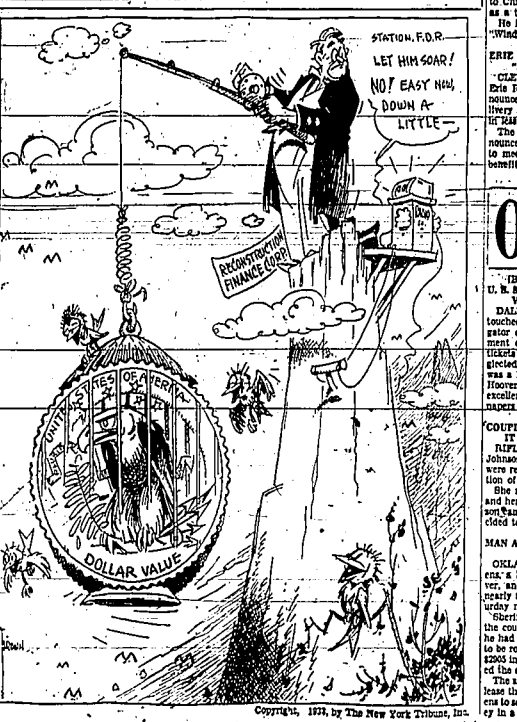

Two of the heaviest full recoveries of all claims of the state as quickly as the other eight which were necessary before any pardon point can be officially made.
